### Charity Ride

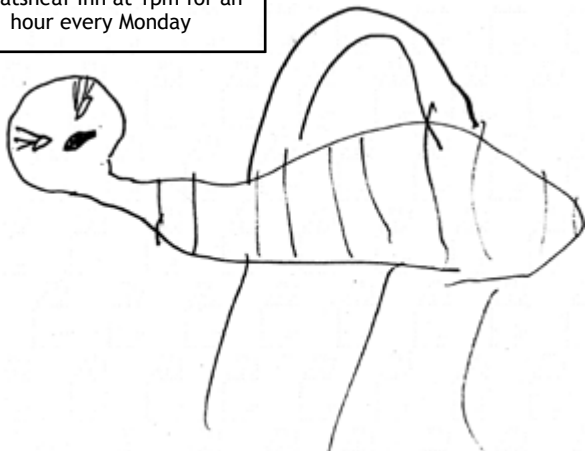

This resolution was "this meeting urges HM Government to provide treatment and therapy in a more appropriate and secure residential environment", in view of the adverse effect on families of people with severe mental health problems.
