My partner and I visited the New Inn, Blencogo, on a busy Friday evening during March. Fortunately, we had reserved a table as it was full up.

As my partner was driving, she had a soft drink before ordering followed by a glass of very acceptable house white with her meal, I decided to stick to Yates Bitter for the evening as I do prefer our local brews.

My partner started with Prawn Cocktail @ £3.80 which she considered very nice while I had Duck and Apricot Brandy Pate with Toast and Cumberland Sauce @ £3.40 which was an excellent choice.

For our main course I had Pan Fried Fillet Steak Garni with potatoes and vegetables @ £11.95. The steak was cooked exactly as requested and was excellent, as were the vegetables.

My partner ordered Braised Medallions of Beef Fillet in Red Wine with Shallot and Mushroom Sauce, served with Yorkshire Pudding accompanied by potatoes and vegetables @ £11.95. She declared everything cooked to perfection, however, for a change, she did not manage to finish the Beef, she felt the portion was just too much!

The service was mainly carried out by local girls who were smartly dressed in black and white outfits who managed to be quite efficient as well as friendly.

Volunteers arrived in style for the morning's beach clean. Armed with litter pickers, gloves and bin liners, a small band of us set off to scour the beach and 'tidy'.

After a good two hours of combing the beach from the north to the south end of Allonby, we were treated to a cup of coffee at the 'Yamajam' cafe. It was good to see that there was, in fact very little litter, but we still managed to collect at least 10 bagfuls.

After lunch 20 pupils from Allonby Primary School joined us along with Rachael Yannick from the Cumbria Marine Litter Project.

After explaining about the types of litter and the harm it does, Rachael lead the way down to the beach and organised the children into cleaning groups. The children were raring to go, and no one could have missed them in their red nose day outfits!

Mrs Nimmo's class managed to work away for an hour, and handed their prized bags of rubbish to Rachael to take away and analyse the contents and weight. The total weight was 22kgs, with 563 items collected, including 296 plastic, 169 fishing, 12 polystyrene, 15 rubber, 19 glass, 7 paper, 17 metal, 12 wood and 19 other, an excellent effort! Of this 4kgs can go for recycling.
