Local Member of Parliament, Tony Cunningham was in Silloth on Friday 12th May.

He held a meeting with Silloth Mayor Bill Allison before visiting Carrs Mill to see the large amount of investment being put into their factory at the harbour.

Tony said "it was really impressive seeing the standard of production being achieved in Silloth, this is a world class facility that the whole town should be proud of".

After the meeting, Tony went on to the Golf Hotel for a meeting organised by the Silloth & District Business Association with guests from the Town Council and other interested parties. A useful discussion took place covering many items of local interest. The achievements and hopes of the Business Association and Silloth Regeneration Partnership were discussed and Tony assured everyone he would always be available to help where his in uence could be useful.

Nigel Harrison from Solway Rural Initiative had also been invited to the meeting to tell everyone of the successful funding bid he has been working on for several years. This has achieved £260,000 of investment over two years to support local businesses in North Allerdale through the creation of a Buy Local Centre in Aspatria and the creation of the SolwayPages.org web site, putting hundreds of local businesses on to the internet free of charge. Both these projects are designed to work together to encourage more people to spend money with local companies. An extra £10 per week from each household spent locally would put another £10 million into the North Allerdale economy each year. It is intended to get this whole project operational in the very near future.

Tony did say it was a pleasure to be in Silloth where everyone was taking a very positive attitude to the future and working hard to make the town more successful and a pleasant place to live and visit.

He stayed much longer than intended and rushed off very late for his next meeting in Keswick, I would have thought he was very envious of the relatively slow pace of life in Silloth compared to the rushing about he has to do when he returns home from Westminster at the end of each week.
