At this time of the year the shoots of fresh herbs and new growth are apparent in the garden. Cut the stalks of chives, leaves of mint and parsley, feathery fronds of both green and bronze fennel and young shoots of spinach and sorrel to add to a plain lettuce. All these when finely chopped can transform a dull salad into a really tasty one.

Make a dressing of 3 tablespoons olive oil, 1 tablespoon lemon juice, 1 teaspoon mustard and a clove to garlic to pour over the salad just before eating.
