March began with a visit of the Dutch ship RUBYN with a cargo of wheat, followed by the 95 metre long Russian ship BALTISKIY -102 with a cargo of bulk fertilizer from St Petersburg. This was quickly followed by ANDRINA-F also with bulk fertiliser

The two Ramsey Steamship ships BENMAYE and BEN ELLEN then loaded bags of fertiliser outward for the Scottish Isles this being a new trade.

There was then a quiet spell before the British ship BOWCLIFFE arrived with cargo of bulk fertiliser from Ijmuden in Holland. The ELKE arrived next with a cargo of wheat and the BEM MAYE loaded another cargo of bagged fertilser for the Scottish isles

The tanker GEVOSTAR with a cargo of bulk molasses from Amsterdam arrived on the 29th thus ending a relatively calm and busy month, quite definitely an improvement on February.
