One of the Best - Again!



Silloth Green in Sillothon-Solway, Cumbria is one of the very best in the UK and that's official.

The award recognises and rewards the best parks and green spaces across the country. A Green Flag flying overhead is a sign to the public that the space boasts the highest possible standards, is beautifully maintained and has excellent facilities.

Councillor Bill Jefferson, Chair of Silloth-on-Solway Town Council's Parks Committee, said: "We are absolutely delighted to receive a Green Flag Award for the third time from Keep Britain Tidy."

Three separate park areas, namely: 'The Green,' 'Harbour Green' and 'Skinburness Green,' are collectively known as 'Silloth Green,' one of the largest village greens in the North of England. The green space boasts spectacular views over the Solway Firth to Criffel and the Caerlaverock Hills in the North and the Lake District to the South. It forms a green link between Silloth's grand regency townscape and the sea front promenade, for many years

attracting visitors seeking fresh sea air and recreational facilities

Successful funding bids in 2010 resulted in a two-year programme to refurbish the Green and restore its heritage buildings. Heritage Lottery Fund put forward £1.1m and the Rural **Development Programme** for England provided funds of £100k. The Edwardian ladies toilets, built in 1910 and the spectacular Victorian pagoda built on a mound overlooking the sea have been sympathetically refurbished.

Officially re-opened in 2012, the Green now boasts a modern water-play area, an entertainment area in local Cumbrian sandstone, a woodland adventure play area, a Putting Green and newly revamped BMX track. Interpretation panels and signage provide information and beautiful oak picnic tables and benches are to be found in various locations, all accessible by new shrub lined paths that allow disabled access to all main areas.

The Green's Community Garden, funded by Heritage Lottery and designed with input from local people,

was opened in May 2014. 'Friends of the Green' care for the 'Community Garden', which is situated on the corner of Criffel Street and Lawn Terrace. During 2015, the new Rose Garden, which is situated closer to the sea, benefitted from new drainage and has been replanted with a variety of roses and a number of bee loving plants. A bee hotel has been erected in the middle of the striking display of rose bushes, plants and shrubs, creating a haven for the local bee and butterfly population.

Get Comic Relief Funding

Cumbria Community Foundation is calling for local community groups, resident associations, community centres, social enterprises, community interest companies and credit unions to apply for a share of £13,000.

Comic Relief is offering the money, raised through Red Nose Day and Sport Relief, to help community and sports projects through their 'Local Communities' programme. The programme aims to empower local people to create a lasting change in their community by increasing access to sport, exercise and local services, building skills of local people, increasing community cohesion and social inclusion.

Annalee Holliday, Grants and Donor Services Officer at Cumbria Community Foundation said: "Cumbria **Community Foundation** has been working with Comic Relief since 2009 and we have awarded more than £140,000 in grants to support community groups and charities in our local area. We are very pleased to continue this relationship as there are still many communities in Cumbria



that suffer from economic and social deprivation and the current economic climate may make this situation worse."

A proportion of the money available will be allocated to projects which 'increase access to sport and exercise for people who face social exclusion and isolation'.

Town Council Report, Shelter Repairs Approved

Silloth Town Council met on 7th September for its usual monthly meeting and here are some of the highlights.

1. The Council are to send a letter to the Solway Buzz, congratulating all the various organisations and the community following a highly successful tourist season for the town.

2. A letter has been received asking about the lack of B & B's in the town and asking whether the Council are using legislation to deter new ones starting. The Council would actively support any new businesses wishing to set up in the town. The Clerk is to check that the Town Council's accommodation page on the website is up to date which includes holiday lets, caravan sites and B & B's in the area.

3. The monthly Police report included a list of helpful ways to protect your property and a copy of this is to be made available on the Council's Facebook page.

4. Clare Stabler, of North Allerdale Development Trust, which runs the Friday Night Project in the Community Sports Hall, has requested financial support for the group to continue over the next year. After some discussion it was agreed to support this venture but to also ask that the Sports Hall reduce the rent for this vital community group.

5. John Cook has been looking into the possibility of providing free wifi on the Green and is at present discussing the matter with both Allerdale and local broadband providers.

6. The shelter at Skinburness which was brought to light following a social media campaign, is to be repaired after receiving funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund. A number of estimates were received from local tradesman and it was agreed that the work be undertaken by Mark Beverley. Story Decorating has also kindly offered to paint the building.

Dear Buzz.

It is my intention to begin a history of the Port Carlisle and Silloth Railways.

September 7th marked the 51st anniversary of the closure of the Silloth route.

During my recent research I have discovered that from the November 1856 Bradshaws timetable, three months after the opening of the Drumburgh - Silloth live - a Saturday and only stop was made at Causewayhead (at first listed as Causey Head) as well as at Black Dyke, Sleightholme (near Abbeytown) and New Dykes Brow, which I believe to be Kirkbride.

Causewayhead (then open daily) last appears in the April 1859 Bradshaw; Sleightholme last appearing in the June 1857 Bradshaw and New Dykes Brow in that for October 1866. If anyone could let me have pictures of named station staff I would be most grateful; especially Robert S. Dixon (Station Master 1944-59), and of the train standing in the Convalescent Home platform and any of the former pier and railway yard turntable.

Could someone at the Rugby Club inform me how long the playing field had been on the Marshalling Yard and Station area and when it opened (1980's I believe) and whether bought from British Railways Property Board and the price paid for the site.

On the Water Front

Shipbreaking at Silloth

During the mid-1960's, a number of small ships were scrapped at Silloth Docks, by the Ardmore Steel Company. Most of these ageing and lifeless vessels were brought to Silloth by tugs. A total of nine vessels were dismantled between March 1965 and September 1966. They were, in order of arrival; 'Huskisson,' 'Trymgarth,' 'Hessam', 'Brynforth', 'Margam,' 'S.E. Cooper,' 'John L.K, HMS 'Niger, HMS 'Chameleon'.

Occasionally, the use of oxy-acetylene torches got out of hand!

moored in the area. These old warships were to be the last two vessels that were dismantled here and both had been completely demolished by September 1966.

Even today, the skeletal remains of a scrapped vessel can still be seen, part buried in the mud and shingle at the outer end of Marshall Dock, whilst a few small bits and pieces of scrap metal can be found on the quayside, a lasting legacy

> from Silloth's brief venture into the shipbreaking business, fifty years ago.

The process of cutting up these vessels, which ranged from tugs, dredgers, a small ex-Admiralty store ship and two ex-Royal navy minesweepers, took place on the south side of the Marshall Dock. Large parts of the vessels were lifted off the gradually diminishing hulk, onto the quayside for cutting into smaller manageable pieces. Those pieces were then sold to scrap metal dealers

As a result of the dredging operations during August by the 'Cherry Sand,' the silt in the New Dock is always disturbed into large hills and valleys.

.

By allowing the dock to fully empty on the lowest of tides, the small cliff faces tend to fall into the valleys, helping to smooth out the bottom of the dock, making

it more suitable for shipping. For this reason the dock was drained several times at the end of August, and looked quite different from its usual serene self.

and taken away by lorry, or even by small coasters that berthed alongside the scrap yard.

Two distinctive vessels that ended their days in Silloth's Marshall Dock, were the ex-Royal Navy minesweepers, HMS' Niger' M73, which arrived in February 1966, and HMS 'Chameleon' M387 which arrived two months later. Towards the latter stages of the scrapping of HMS Chameleon, she broke adrift from her quayside mooring during a gale and ended up lying across the entrance to the New Dock, damaging a number of fishing boats

Silloth welcomed Manchester side Aldwinians for their first ever North Lancs/Cumbria game to be played on Silloth's turf. After last weeks outstanding 34-5 away win at Ashton under Lyne, although confident, the Tigers knew that a bigger challenge awaited.

As the sun shone and the crowds gathered Silloth got the game under way.
