Internet Broadband

The simple truth is that the area covered by the Buzz is unlikely to get a broadband connection from BT within the foreseeable future!

Realising this, Bill Knowles, Business Development Manager for the Solway Rural Initiative is pursuing grants to provide a rural broadband scheme for North Allerdale. This will include the towns Silloth, Wigton, Aspatria and Maryport. Also included will be the rural areas around those towns.

In order to strengthen the grant application it is very important that anyone who would be interested in having a broadband connection to their business or home registers that interest with Bill now.

Because of the rural nature of this area, the scheme being planned

by SRI will avoid the problem of expensive telephone exchange upgrades by using a two-way satellite link to a group of four satellites with local connections by radio link.

This exciting system is up to four times as fast as BT's ADSL service and would move us from being an internet backwater into being an internet leader. Unless the rural economy is given the opportunity to compete on level terms, it will always struggle to survive. Monthly rental costs should be no more than BT's charges for broadband and may be even cheaper.
