We also had a coal Chute to put cargoes into steamers to go across to Ireland. We had slate boats, bringing cargoes from Wales. The "Harlow Plain", "Enid", "Sybil Mary" and the little "Pandora" the smallest of the four.

We had Fisons Chemical Works too, which brought us some big ship loads of "Phosphate", "Sulphur Ore", "Basic Slag" and "Kaynet".

Last but not least we have Carrs Mill making flour and cattle foods, all the wheat and maize used to be shipped by Monks of Liverpool their names were all called after women except the "Shoreham"

, "T.P. Tilling" and the "J.J.Monks", the women's names were "Alice", "Gertie", "Florence", "Claretta", "Clara Monks", "Isabelletta", "Elizabeta", "Susetta", "Queenie", "Madie" and "Agnes Ellen".

Carrs used to send a shipload of flour to Belfast about every three weeks but that stopped when the war started and that order was never repeated. We used to load Schooners with bran and pairings, it was stored in the long shed where the Cubing Plant is situated now. There was the "General Havelock", "Twin Sisters", Harvest" and the "Solway Lass".

We also had our own tugboat called the "Petrel" stationed here. Her job was to help the big ships enter the port, also tow out the Schooners and take out the dredging hopper to empty in the deep-water channel.
