December was a busier month with seven ships using the port.

The Russian ship BALTISKIY-102 arrived at the beginning of the month with a cargo of fertilizer from St. Petersburg, closely followed by the tanker OSTRIA with a cargo of molasses round the coast from Hull. The ARKLOW BAY was next with a cargo of fertilizer from IJMUIDEN. The GEORGETTE TRADER then brought a cargo of wheat from Bonnières in France and another cargo of wheat from Rostock in Germany came on the JAN RASMUS. The BEN ELLAN brought two cargoes of wheat from Liverpool during the month.

All shipping operations were completed before the start of Christmas and New Year celebrations.
