What an Organ

On Saturday 26th November at 7:30pm, there was a recital of Advent and Christmas Organ music, given by Mr. Ian Hare Ma.Mus.b at St Andrew's Church in Silloth, in order to raise much needed funds for the repair and renovation of this most beautiful organ. The estimated cost of this work is £3,000!

The organ was originally a house organ, made for the mansion at Helensburgh, known as "Cairndhu." St Andrew's Presbyterian Church was looking for a replacement organ and they were informed that there was a pipe organ for sale from Lord Strathclyde's mansion in Helensburgh. The cost, including transport and installation, would be about £400. The organ was dedicated on 11th November 1946 by Rev. Purvis Boyes.

The church fitted an electric blower to the organ, which means it was probably hand-blown at "Cairndhu." The beautifully carved case of the organ is typical of a house organ, where the organ is a piece of furniture as well as a musical instrument.

Mr Hare began playing organs at the tender age of 8 years and began his musical training at Hymers College, Hull and at St. Mary's

a Fellow of the Royal College of Organists at the age of 16 years and went on to Kings College, Cambridge. He has an extensive repertoire of organ music ranging from the 16th century to the present day, including a special interest in music by British composers. Mr Hare has performed widely in Britain and abroad, including France, Germany, Holland and the USA. He has played at many of the major London venues, notably Westminster Abbey, St. Paul's Cathedral, The Temple Church and an appearance at the BBC Proms! Ian has made several recordings, including broadcasts for radio and television and some solo organ CDs. He is also a composer, specialising in choral and organ music and has had a number of works performed and published in Britain and the USA. Appointed Lecturer in Music at Lancaster University in 1974 and subsequently becoming the first University Organist, in 2006 Ian was awarded an Honorary Fellowship and retired after 40 years of service. He has recently taken the post of organist at St. Oswald's Church in Grasmere.

When it Rains, it Kills

Cumbria Fire and Rescue Service (CFRS) teams are supporting a new Highways England road safety campaign - 'When it Rains, It Kills.

Drivers are being urged to slow down when it's raining, after almost 3,000 people were killed or seriously injured nationally when driving in the rain last year. The campaign follows latest statistics which show that people are 30

times more likely to be killed or seriously injured when driving in rain than in snow.

The figures also reveal that travelling too fast for the conditions was identified as a factor in 1 in 9 road deaths in Great Britain last year, with drivers failing to alter how they drive in response to changing conditions on the road.

Highways England is warning that even driving within the speed limit in wet weather could be dangerous if drivers don't allow extra space between them and the vehicle in front. This message is being reinforced with rainactivated warning messages visible to people leaving motorway service stations.

Richard Leonard, Head of Road Safety for Highways England, said: "Most of us already slow down in snow, ice or fog but when it rains we consider it normal so don't adapt our driving. The sad fact is that 2,918 people were killed or seriously injured nationally on the roads when it was raining last year, and not slowing down to suit the current conditions was identified as a factor in 1 in 9 of all road deaths. Rain makes it harder for tyres to grip the road and harder for drivers to see ahead -

significantly increasing the chances of being involved in a collision. We've launched our new campaign to make drivers aware of the dangers and to stay safe."

Mark Ducie, Community Safety Manager for Cumbria Fire and Rescue Service,

said: "We're supporting the 'When it rains, it kills' campaign from Highways England because we've seen time and again how wet conditions

have caused accidents on Cumbria roads. The statistics speak for themselves and we urge all drivers to follow the advice of Highways England and to be aware of weather forecasts when planning journeys."

A new road safety video has been produced, directed by award-winning photographer Nadav Kander, which shows rain falling inside the home of a family imagined to have been involved in a serious road

It generally takes at least twice as long to stop on a wet road as on a dry road because tyres have less grip on the surface. In wet weather you should:

- slow down if the rain and spray from other vehicles is making it difficult to see and
- keep well back from the vehicle in front as this will increase your ability to see and plan ahead
- ${\color{blue} \bullet}$ ease off the accelerator and slow down gradually if the steering becomes unresponsive as it probably means that water is preventing the tyres from gripping the road

In total, 197 people lost their lives on roads during rainfall in Great Britain last year and 2,721 suffered a serious injury, compared to 14 deaths and 153 serious injuries during fog, and 2 deaths and 95 serious injuries during snow.

Highways England is aiming to reduce the number of people killed or seriously injured on England's motorways and major A roads by 40% by 2020 through road improvements, safety campaigns and other initiatives.

Memorial Services 60 Years on from Tragedy

On Saturday 10th December 2016 two memorial services took place to commemorate 60 years since the tragic loss of life of four Silloth firemen.

The first service, held at 9:30am at Grune Point, Skinburness, was private and for the families of those who lost their lives. This act of remembrance was a very moving and emotional service for all who attended. The lifeboat and her crew stood by during the service. A wreath was then laid by the lifeboat crew who then launched four para flares in recognition of the four firemen who were lost. The names of Alex Ramsay, John Johnstone, Joseph Bell and Stanley Graham were announced before each flare

was launched.

The second service, for the general public, was held at Silloth lifeboat station at 12 noon, where a memorial sculpture was unveiled by Senior Helmsman Steve Henderson. The memorial serves as a source of inspiration for current and future generations of Lifeboat Crew, Lifeguards, Supporters and Fund-raisers. It reminds us that there are still people who volunteer to carry out selfless acts of heroism to help others and we will always remember their sacrifice. The sculpture bears the motto of Sir William Hillary 'With courage,





'MAKING CUMBRIA AN EVEN SAFER PLACE' **Independent Custody Visitor Scheme**

As part of my remit, I operate an Independent Custody Visiting Scheme which currently has 45 volunteers. The scheme enables independent members of the local community to make weekly unannounced visits to check on the welfare of people in police custody. In the period June to September 2016 the visitors carried out a total of 63 visits and spoke to or observed 121 detainees in custody. During October the four Panels held one of their 4 monthly meetings when they talked about the visits they had carried out and raised any issues identified. These were then discussed with the local custody inspector.

As part of the scheme our volunteers have the opportunity to attend a North West regional conference. This year it was held on 15th October held at Haydock Park. The day provided seminar and training sessions relating to custody visiting and 18 of our volunteers attended.

I was really pleased to see such a variety of community groups coming forward for funding in conjunction with their Community Policing Teams. In early December I was fortunate to visit Gulliver House, which is run by Turning Point, in Whitehaven. Gulliver House is a 24 hour supported living, recovery and rehabilitation service in West Cumbria that provides intensive support to nine individuals with significant mental health issues to encourage them to take control over their own life situation

Solway Community School's annual prizegiving on Wednesday 30th November was, as always, a fantastic evening event. Police and Crime Commissioner Colonel Peter McCall gave the keynote address and, as a local boy himself, the theme was how the students should look beyond their horizons and how, with hard work and commitment, anything is achieveable.

Certainly the evening celebrated achievement across every year group with proud parents looking on as many students were awarded prizes for outstanding achievement in academic results, sporting excellence and community work. New this year was an award sponsored by the RNLI for our Junior Lifeboat Crew who volunteered to take part in a six week training course, supported by the lifeboat station, and who were very proud to accept the award for community service.

Perhaps the most moving part of the evening came when former student Emily Smith, now studying for A levels, spoke to current students with advice for how to make the most of the Solway experience. 





The special one-off programme is in addition to the county council's usual standard annual gully clearing programme and is intended to ensure Cumbria's streets are able to drain as quickly as possible in the event of heavy rain.

The gully cleaning programme has been broken into three areas - East (3663

Cllr Keith Little, Cabinet Member for Highways and Transport, said: "Blocked gullies prevent water draining away quickly, making our roads more dangerous. So after the volume of rain last winter we're keen to make sure that the county's roads are as well prepared as possible. That's why we have invested additional resources in this 'gully blitz' to make sure the county's highways network is ready when the weather

Need a Carers Emergency Card?

Peace of mind in case of an emergency

Do you look after someone who can't manage without your help? Do you worry about what would happen to the person you care for if you are caught up in an emergency? What if you are rushed to hospital due to your own health problems

You could be unexpectedly delayed returning from holiday

Perhaps your car breaks

Have you considered a Carers Emergency Card?

The Cumbria Carers Emergency Card scheme is designed to give reassurance. It gives you the opportunity to develop an Emergency Plan covering a 72 hour (3 day) period. This plan can be activated with one phone call (to a 24 hour response centre) if an emergency occurs and you are unable to look after the person you care for.

You will be given a Carers Emergency Card, the card has the phone number of the response centre, your name and the unique reference number that is linked to your Emergency Plan. You must then keep the card with you, it is about the size of a credit card and so is easily carried in a purse or wallet.

In an emergency the details on the card would alert the emergency services or anyone else present that



they must ring the response centre. This is particularly important if, due to the situation, you are unable to communicate this yourself.

The response centre would use the unique reference number from the card to identify you and take the action to make sure the person you care for is looked

after according to the plan you developed.

How do I apply for a Carers Emergency Card?

to repair flood damaged infrastructure, including roads and bridges. A lot of progress has been made over the past 12 months and we are well on the road to recovery but there is a huge amount of work still to do. We have also been working with local communities to help them become more resilient this winter. As part of this effort, we have worked with our partners to launch this new campaign including our new dedicated website to provide a one-stop source of information and advice to help residents and businesses prepare for the coming winter.

"We will also be promoting this key information to people through all of our social media platforms. One of the things we learnt during the floods was the valuable role that social media has to play in helping us keep people informed and up to date."
