

Causeway-head WI

The July meeting of the Causewayhead WI was held on Wednesday 12 July 2017.

The speaker was Ian Tyler and his subject was Mines and Minerals of the Lakes. There are 24 different minerals found in Cumbria, amongst these are coal, iron, silver, graphite, lead, sand, salt, barite, gypsum. In a lead vein there are 5-6 different minerals. Many of these minerals are sent all over the world and used in many different ways eg graphite to make cannon balls, pencils (Cumbria's graphite is the best in the world), lead for bullets and ammunition, barite in medical practice, gypsum in plaster board and plaster of paris.

The finest slate in the world can be found at Honister as this is much thicker and stronger than the thinner Welsh Slate. The quarry men are highly skilled at their craft. Ian then showed slides of the different mines to be found in Cumbria after which he answered questions.

Frances Jackson then gave a vote of thanks for what had been a very interesting and informative evening.



120 carers in West Cumbria have been supported to claim over £275,000 of benefits by the Carers Benefit Support Worker, Lynne Christie-Quinn, in the last 12 months.

Lynne explains 'Navigating your way through the benefits system understanding entitlement and completing paperwork is complicated and time consuming. A real headache for busy, stressed carers. This service has supported 120 carers to access benefits they often don't even know they are entitled to.'

The additional costs involved with living with illness or disability can cause people to struggle financially. The money that you may be entitled to can make a huge difference to how you feel:

- no longer worrying about big winter heating bills dropping through the letter box
- not having to count every penny when shopping for food
- not stressing about the cost of care or equipment.

Lynne holds regular monthly clinic appointments providing benefit information

Silloth Library on the 2nd Wednesday of the month between 10am and 1pm.




Yes folk, a change with tradition! We do not usually meet in August, but this year we decided to go for a trip over the Border.

Allerdale Borough Council is asking people to 'BIN IT 4 BEACHES' this summer to keep our coastline clean and litter free.

The campaign is part of efforts by LOVE My BEACH to show how taking a few simple steps can help keep our beaches and the sea clean. Recent news stories have highlighted the amount of plastic and other waste in the seas and on beaches. One major concern is wet wipes which many people find buried in the sand next to their picnic spot.

As wet wipes have become more and more popular with people, the numbers appearing on our beaches has increased. The Marine Conservation Society's annual beach litter survey shows that the number of wet wipes found on UK beaches has risen by 700% over the last decade. Millions of wipes are wrongly flushed down the toilet each year with a small percentage reaching our beaches and seas. Whilst some of the

products say they are able to be flushed down the toilet, many aren't passing the tests set by water companies and aren't breaking down quickly enough in the sewerage system. These can end up on our beaches.

Therefore the #binit4beaches campaign is calling on everyone, whether they live by the sea or not, to remember that only the 3P's should be flushed down the toilet - pee, poo and (toilet) paper. Wet wipes and similar products should be put in the bin, whatever it says on the packet.

Carni McCarron-Holmes, Executive member with responsibility for environmental health, said: "We have one of the best coastlines in the UK, much of it has rightly been designated an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. However, unfortunately our throw-away society is having a negative effect on keeping it pristine and clean for everyone to enjoy. I fully support this campaign. It is

something where we can all make a difference whether you are a visitor in Keswick, or a resident of Allonby. It's time we all started to bin it for beaches."

Whilst our beaches and seas are cleaner than they have been for many years, the Council has been an active supporter of the LOVE My BEACH campaign to encourage people to take a few simple steps to help keep them this way. Alongside wet wipes it also encourages people not to pour fats oils and greases down the sink.



These can cause blockages reducing the effectiveness of the sewerage systems, resulting in effluent ending up in the sea.

The Council is also helping to organise a series of events as part of the Marine Conservation Society's Great British beach cleans. These clean-ups will be held on Oldside Shore, Workington on Friday 15 September 2017 and on Harrington Shore on Sunday 17 September 2017. 
I remember clearly going to Mrs. Brisco's house which was next to the picture house (now the Spar shop) to be fitted out with our outfit which as you see was very special and was the same for both male and female. I don't remember how many years the carnival continued until there was a gap, possibly 1950.

I do know that in 1972 the Round Table decided to have an annual sports day on the green. This was the idea of Round Table member David Ritchie who at that time was the manager of the District Bank in Eden Street, which became the NatWest until recently. After two years we Round Tablers decided to open up to a full carnival and so it has remained until the present day. All of this time I have been part of the carnival in many capacities and my main duty was Commentator / Master of Ceremonies.

I followed Mrs Diane Shaw as



chairman and was followed by John Hope. We all served about ten years. During my term in 1994 and in 1995 I was also Silloth mayor, see the 1994 photograph. I am grateful for the helpful support of my late wife Mary over so many years. She passed away in 2014. Last year I was invited to help with the judging. As the parade was due to start and I was asked if I could manage the route. A voice from behind said "I will get him round"! The voice was that of Mrs Rachel Ingram the Primary School head who was also a judge. Having a cup of tea after the parade I happened to say to Mrs Ingram, if I am here next year (2017) it will be 70 years since I was first involved with Silloth Carnival. She



New Molasses Tanker from France

The tanker ORAVITA arrived on the mid-day tide with a full cargo of molasses from the French port of Montoir. What better way to spend a Sunday afternoon than with a stroll along the shore to watch ships!

Having boarded at Workington, the Silloth pilot had timed this final leg of the sailing to arrive about 20 minutes before high water to allow himself time to position the ship to enter port. For onlookers that 20 minutes seemed to last for ever. The vessel had made the three day sailing from the Bay of Biscay after being



loaded from a bulk carrier with product originating from Central America. Molasses are a by-product of sugar refining and traded as a world commodity. Silloth receives about six deliveries a year

from ports across Europe. Once berthed at the discharge point, the syrupy liquid is pumped out of the ship into dockside storage tanks. Molasses are mixed with other ingredients at Caltech's adjacent plant for the production of 'Crystalyx' animal feed concentrate.

The Singapore registered tanker is a new visitor to Silloth taking the place of the

familiar ZAPADNY. Both ships are of similar capacity but ORAVITA is more manoeuvrable as she is fitted with bow thrusters. These were put to good use when the 98 metre ship needed to turn towards her berth in the confined space of New Dock. Two days after arrival she was unloaded and ready to sail to pick up her next order in Hamburg.

Call Blocking Service Scam

Cumbria Trading Standards have received reports of residents being cold called by a London company offering to sell a telephone nuisance call blocking service for £99. The company will often claim to work with or on behalf of your telephone company and know some personal information.

The service/device they are offering is unlikely to exist and it is simply an attempt to obtain credit card or other financial information from

consumers. Cumbria Trading Standards and Cumbria Police advice is simple; don't give personal or financial information to any cold callers. Often these sellers prey on the most vulnerable. For all your goods and services it is better to deal with reputable traders operating out of fixed premises who you know and trust.

Consumers can register their details with the

Help for Young Drivers

Newly qualified young drivers in Cumbria are being offered help to enhance their driving skills and stay safe behind the wheel.

Cumbria Road Safety Partnership (CRSP) is encouraging young people aged 17-24 who have recently passed their driving test to take up the Pass Plus scheme. Pass Plus is delivered by approved local driving instructors and is designed to enhance the skills and knowledge of a newly-

qualified driver, focusing on specific areas such as driving on motorways and night driving. Young drivers who complete Pass Plus training can be eligible for discounts on their motor insurance.

Councillor Keith Little, Cumbria County Council Cabinet member for Highways, said: "The Pass Plus scheme is a great way for newly qualified drivers to stay safe and drive down their insurance costs. Pass Plus training helps new drivers cope with the challenges they'll face on the road with greater confidence and I am pleased the Road Safety Partnership is once again subsidising this vital training for young drivers."

Chris Broadbent, CRSP road safety co-ordinator, said: "Passing your driving test is

just the first stage in learning to drive. Statistics nationally show young drivers are more at risk of being involved in a road collision than any other age group, largely because of their lack of experience behind the wheel. The Pass Plus scheme is a great way to develop your driving skills and we would like more young drivers to take up our offer of the Pass Plus subsidy, which is worth £100 per person. In Cumbria we estimate that currently 40% of young people aged 17-24, hold a full driving licence and are therefore eligible to receive the subsidy."

Funding for the Pass Plus subsidy is limited and will be allocated to applicants on a first come, first served basis. To apply for your Pass Plus voucher, email passplus@cumbria.gov.uk

Age 11 to 18: Make Your Mark!

Cumbria County Council is encouraging young people across the county to have their voices heard by casting a vote in the Make Your Mark 2017 ballot, and by becoming Make Your Mark Champions in their school or college to encourage more young people to take part.

Make Your Mark is led by the UK's Youth Parliament and provides a unique opportunity for young people to have their say on the issues that matter to them. The Make Your Mark campaign runs throughout September and early October, with a celebration event held during or close to October half term.

Jacob Reid, Member of Youth Parliament for Carlisle and Eden, said: "It's no secret that the concerns of Young People have gone unanswered for too long in this country - but this is changing; in recent years the national Make Your Mark ballot has been completed by millions of young people now they have a platform to raise their views and ideas. The Youth Parliament's campaigns have enabled meaningful change to occur both locally and nationally on issues affecting young people - from tackling the stigma around mental health to increasing the accessibility of PSHE resources. Ultimately, the Make Your Mark ballot is a success because of the young people who participate in it - whether they champion it in schools or simply cast a vote. This is an opportunity for young people to have their say and I would strongly encourage all young people in Cumbria to get involved!"

Councillor Sue Sanderson, Cabinet Member for Schools

and Learning, said: "The UK Youth Parliament is a fantastic platform for young people's views to be heard and debated. The views and interests of young people are extremely important and I'm delighted so many young people in Cumbria are keen to have their say on the issues that matter to them. I'd encourage all young people to get involved in the Make Your Mark campaign through their school, college or youth group and to cast a vote on the topics and ideas that affect them and their future – they are our leaders of tomorrow and this is a superb way to start understanding how voting, representation and democracy works in action."

Following their training,

the Make Your Mark Champions will volunteer alongside teachers and students in their school, academy or college to ensure as many young people as possible have their voices heard by voting in the ballot. They will be empowered to take charge of the Make Your Mark campaign and report the results from their institution to the UK Youth Parliament. There are several ways to encourage participation and collect results - including hosting a special assembly, class talks, holding a stall at break times, or an online forum.
