

## Walking for Health in Silloth



Active Cumbria, part of Cumbria County Councils Public Health Team are leading on a new Countywide Walking for Health Scheme and are recruiting and training new walk leaders across the County.

Working in partnership with Silloth Group Medical Practice a new health walk has just been launched in the Silloth area. The walk aims to not only help people to get out and about and explore their local area but also to provide people who, for various reasons, may have become quite isolated the opportunity to socialise and make new friends.

Walk leader, Living Well Coach Simon McCall said: "Silloth Group Medical Practice recently introduced our new Wellbeing Service, which takes a holistic approach to supporting patients by recognising that factors such as lifestyle and social challenges, as well as medical conditions, all impact upon our overall health and wellbeing. We have joined the Walking for Health network to develop a programme of short, gentle walks to suit all ages and abilities. Our walks are an ideal starting point for anyone who may feel they are less physically or socially active than they would like

This new group has been set up in partnership with Active Cumbria, with the focus upon planning suitable walks across the County within the Walking for Health framework. Walking for Health is England's largest network of free group health walk schemes, run by the Ramblers and supported through funding from players of People's postcode lottery.

Aileen Grant, Development Officer at Active Cumbria said: "At Active Cumbria our focus is upon tackling inactivity and supporting people to become more physically active within their own communities, and what better way to do this than walking. Nationally, we know that walking is the most popular activity, and a near perfect thing to do for those looking to become more active. We would love to see as many people as possible joining our health walks and discovering some of the fantastic scenery on their doorsteps."

The first Silloth group walk took place on Thursday 2nd May, starting and finishing at Silloth Medical Practice on Lawn Terrace at 2pm. The walks take about 20 minutes to complete. The group is free to join and all are welcome on these fortnightly walks.

## HCA Getting Creative to Help Save the World



Holm Cultram Abbey CE School goes creative as part of their 'Act Local, Think Global' project.

This year as part of our creative week the children of Holm Cultram Abbey asked the question......

How do we continue to ensure

God's creation flourishes?

Having learnt that pollinators are in significant decline the children decided to take action and think about ways they could attract more pollinators into our school environment. Each child produced a piece of poetry and art that represents some of

the important pollinators we need to help our flowers and plants grow. They also worked alongside local artist, Helen Elvin, to create a big willow tunnel and pollinator sculptures.

Pollinators are vital to creating and maintaining the habitats and ecosystems that many



animals rely on for food and shelter. Worldwide, over half the diet of fats and oils comes from crops pollinated by animals. They facilitate the reproduction in 90% of the world's flowering plants.

Following our creative week, the children are putting the following actions into place; planting a meadow area, developing a wild area in our allotment, hanging bird feeders and creating pollinator tyres.

Mrs Nicholson, the

Headteacher, is delighted to see the children taking such a proactive approach to tackling a 'global problem' through their creative ideas. She said, 'it is wonderful to see the children actively problem solving and finding different ways they can contribute towards making our world a better place. Teaching the children through our school values is extremely important at HCA and it is clearly reflected in their current work.'



## Silloth Lifeboat Sent Out an SOS to DA Harrison

An exceptionally low tide on the evening of Thursday 21st March, caused havoc with the launching of Silloth's RNLI Lifeboat on the West Beach.

Night exercises give both the Lifeboat Crew and Shore Crew valuable experience of working together in the dark. Launching on the West Beach is done at low tide as the slipway outside the boathouse is not able to facilitate the launch, due to changed conditions which have resulted in a lack of water. However, on this particular evening, with the tides so exceptionally low, the tractor which had just launched the lifeboat, sank into the soft sand, up to its axle. The tide was coming in very quickly. The heavy trailer was disappearing beneath the waves

and as the tractor tried to free itself, it ended up getting deeper into the sand and sea.

Andrew Winter of Associated British Ports in Silloth was contacted, who then called on assistance from Stephen Carr (Titch) and Adam Carr (Cloiter) who both work for DA Harrison and had been using a twenty two tonnes excavator to clear out the entrance of Silloth dock earlier in the day. They arrived within minutes to help. The caterpillar tracks together with the size of the vehicle are obviously more suited to working on the soft sand than the RNLI tractor.

Attaching the excavator to the tractor, they were able to pull both the tractor and

trailer out of the sand and sea to safety on the harder part of the beach. With the tide still rising there wasn't a lot of time to spare before the tractor and trailer would have to have been abandoned. Silloth RNLI lifeboat would like to thank Titch and Cloiter of DA Harrison and Andrew of ABP in Silloth for turning out so quickly on a cold and blustery evening, to rescue the tractor and trailer.





## Do You Require School Transport

Parents and carers of school pupils who are starting primary or secondary school in September 2019 are being encouraged to apply online for home to school transport.

Cumbria County Council arranges free school transport to pupils who are attending their

catchment or nearest qualifying school and live more than two miles away (up to the age of 8) or more than three miles away (aged 8 and over).


Children from low income groups (ie those who are entitled to free school meals and uniform vouchers, or whose families are in receipt of the maximum level

of Working Tax Credit or Universal Credit) may also be entitled to assistance with transport.


Further information on eligibility, an online application form and Frequently

Asked Questions are available via the council's website www. cumbria.gov.uk/schooltransport. The School Transport team can also be contacted by e-mail school. transport@cumbria.gov.uk if your query cannot be answered via the website.

Applications should be submitted by 31st May to enable the council to assess whether a child has an entitlement to transport, inform parents of the outcome and plan routes before the start of term in September 2019. If applications are received after this date, transport may not be in place until after term starts.

## Silloth's New Motorcycle Museum Opens to Great Acclaim and Large Crowds

A new museum which pays homage to and celebrates Silloth's motorcycling history has been described as a "great success" for the town and for Cumbria.

Silloth Motorcycle Museum opened to the engine sound of almost one hundred bikers who arrived in the town on Good Friday.

It's been founded by local motorcycle legend Jim Snaith, who has put his vast personal collection of bikes, memorabilia and medals on display for the first time. The display also houses the Jim Curry Collection, donated to the museum by the man

Mayor of Silloth Tony Markley was among hundreds of people who turned out to show their support when it was officially opened by British sidecar champion Rob Fisher.

Jim Snaith, a former Isle of Man TT champion, retired as a selfemployed driving instructor through ill health and was unsure what to do with his motorcycle collection.

He decided his collection was wasted sitting in his garage and set about creating a Motorbike Museum, something that would also celebrate the history of Silloth's race track which existed between 1961 and 1982 and once hosted a British Championship meeting that was attended by a crowd of over a thousand people.

The museum is the latest venture in the ground floor of his mother Margaret Snaith's house. It was a cookware shop before that and she also ran it as a ladies clothes shop for

on their own bikes as this will add to the attraction of the museum itself. Since its opening Jim has had a steady stream of visitors every day with weekends being most popular.



## April Gave Us an A to Z of Shipping

Ship's names hold a fascination for enthusiasts who follow their comings and goings. Silloth recently had visits from ships with names at either end of the alphabet, AMMON and ZEELAND. Ship's names beginning with 'A' are quite common but 'Z' less so, although Silloth's regular visitor ZAPADNYY is an exception, her green hull being a familiar sight at the dockside. AMMON and ZEELAND share common features, they are both privately owned by their Dutch captains, are registered in small Dutch towns and use fleet managers to organise their day-to-day operations.

AMMON arrived on a midday tide with a cargo of French wheat from Bordeaux. The grain terminal is situated 50 miles upstream on the River Garonne in the historic port city. The production of speciality flours at Silloth appears to be thriving, no doubt benefitting from the popularity of French breadsticks. So far this year one ship each month has visited from various French Atlantic ports with a cargo of grain. AMMON was previously photographed departing on a summer's afternoon in 2012. The privately owned ship flies the fleet management flag of 'Amasus', a company with responsibility for more than seventy vessels. Privately owned ships often use little known ports as their port of registry, in this case the name of the small Dutch town Midwolda was painted across the stern. The origin of the ship's name is unclear



but could be that of the god Ammon who was worshipped by ancient Egyptians.

Representing the opposite end of the alphabet was ZEELAND which arrived from Ghent with fertiliser. After a three day sailing from the Belgian port she was greeted by a wintry spring morning with rain and sleet in the air. The ship which was built in 2010 has a thorough Dutch pedigree with its name, port of registry, owner and manager all with connections to the Netherlands. The port of registry is the unpronounceable Dutch town of 'Goes' which is situated in the coastal region of Zeeland. The ship was photographed whilst

unloading at the quayside prior to departure to Dublin.

15th Wilson Leer with a cargo of Fertiliser from Klaipeda then on to Corpach.

23rd Eems Sky with a cargo of Fertiliser from Terneuzen then on to Coleraine.

This month saw us not as busy as March, but still ahead of the UK trend and bringing in much needed fertiliser to the Northwest and grain for the Mill.

The unusual ship this month was the Argos carrying Furness

Bottom Ash, used in making cementation blocks for the construction industry. We are hoping that this will now become a regular cargo here for us as it once used to be.

For those of you who were out and about when the Eems Sky arrived, you will have seen the vessel doing a little dance in the middle of the dock and turning to port, instead of the more normal turn to starboard. This was due to her having a slightly different configuration on her engines and propeller such that when using the engines astern, the ship naturally turns to port and rather than fight this natural tendency, it is easier to go with it and turn, what feels like the wrong way, but is the best way.

Our port is doing well and we are still ahead of target and hoping this continues throughout the year.
