

Silloth Paddling Pool

An explanation of the empty paddling pool by Wendy Jameson-Brown, Town Clerk for Silloth Town Council.

"The Town Council have received quite a few complaints about the Paddling Pool on the Green not being filled with water.

It is not simply a matter of filling it up with water and emptying it now and again. With all the health and safety legislation nowadays nothing can be further from the truth. The Chlorine and pH levels of the water needs to be checked on a daily basis, with various chemicals added to keep the water within safe limits. In addition to this, we need a licence from the Environment Agency which will allow us to discharge the waste water back into the Solway. We cannot do anything until we get this licence, which Allerdale Borough Council have applied for on our behalf. Any contravention to this legislation and we run the risk of being fined in the region of £10,000.
