Somethin' Brewin' is a local classic rock/grunge covers band who formed in 2021 and started performing from 2022, and have been going from strength to strength ever since.

Performing in pubs, clubs, festivals and bike rally's from Scotland, throughout the length and breath of Cumbria and Manchester.

The band are made up of Zoe Glencross on vocals, Ashley Robertshaw on guitar, Max Gorman on drums; all from Silloth and Jonny Taylor from Aspatria. It was whilst recording some cover songs at The Music Farm Studio in Egremont with the legendary Tom Tyson; he suggested writing their own material.

Since then, the band have written and recorded some of their own songs. The first single 'Rebel with a cause' is available on all streaming services now and is set to be followed by the next single 'Vikings from the North' on 28th July. The single appears to be popular in America, Australia and Italy.

The album 'Special Brew' features 12 songs (ten classic rock covers and two original tracks) which the band are selling at their gigs, and happily signing the albums for posterity! Now the local HMV stores in Carlisle and Workington have the album on their shelves!

Somethin' Brewin' have been given the great opportunity to do an album launch performance at the stores on 15th July in Carlisle and 29th July in Workington.

Not only that, local radio stations have been big supporters of the band. Internet radio station Enjoy Radio have played the bands material several times, have interviewed the band and are set to do a live radio performance on 12th August.

BBC introducing Cumbria have also

recently played the bands first single. You can catch Somethin' Brewin'

at some local up and coming events including the Vintage Rally, Silloth Carnival and The Balmoral Hotel at the end of the Music & Beer Festival in September.

These are exciting times for Somethin' Brewin' and they'd love for you to come along for the ride!





On Wednesday 14th June we welcomed Kelda Roe from the Cumbria Archives.

Kelda is based at the Cumbria Archives Centre in Carlisle and she is an Archivist. She came to tell us about the role of Archivists and Archives.

Archives are collections of information in many different

Many such items were originally kept for legal requirements, e.g. Title Deeds for properties, wills and estate papers. Archivists make collections available for display and exhibitions and they are responsible for cataloguing and indexing collections. They can also help members of the public who write or email in asking for help finding information and assist people who call into the Archives searching for information too.

The National Archives collection includes a range of diverse items from The Doomsday Book to records of MP's tweets on social media. Archives are also collected by enthusiasts, private individuals and charities.

Kelda herself worked with the Religious Archives at Windsor Castle, then for Unilever looking at brand information. She also spent a year cataloguing archives for Rugby League in Huddersfield and then found her way to Cumbria via the Mountain Heritage Trust where she catalogued things such as mittens, tents and diaries. Kelda also curated the first ever exhibition of Women's Mountain Climbers at Keswick Museum.

As a county, Cumbria is lucky enough to have archives in Kendal, Barrow and Whitehaven as well as Carlisle. Carlisle has recently had a new archive built which includes 12km of mostly moveable/sliding shelving to provide maximum storage. There are 12,000 boxes of Estate Records alone. There are things as diverse as records on mining, railways, social organizations including WI collections, maps and plans, solicitors' legal documents, council documents and even court books which relate to various manors and detail worth, land, boundaries etc.

The archives are accessed by many people, often they will be looking at property details, land or boundary lines or tracing family histories. Currently the archivists in Carlisle are looking to record 60,000 old wills onto a digital platform to make them more easily accessible and to limit damage from handling to the original documents in their care.

Carlisle's Archives also has a conservation team who look to preserve items in the archives and they also do bookbinding work to replace badly damaged covers on old books/documents. New bindings are always sympathetic to the originals.

We are hoping to arrange a visit to the Archives in Carlisle in the near future. Perhaps to peruse the history of the Womens Institute in our county.



Using a shallow tray or pot, depending on the size of the damaged area, compost and lawn seed grow your grass in the same way as any plant.



Using a little compost to ensure the new turf sits at the right height, sit the turf on the compost, use pieces of grass from the pots to fill any gaps



Use the tray/pot as a template and cutout the damaged area in your lawn



Firm the new turf down with you hands and then water well. Resist mowing the newly installed grass for a couple of weeks. The colours will blend in in a month or so!

RNLI Lifeboat Call-Out






Silloth RNLI Lifeboat crew were called from their beds in the early hours of the 7th July to reports of a woman and her dog trapped in a car after the tide had come in around them at Annan on the Scottish coast. The car was completely surrounded by water when crews arrived, the woman and her dog were rescued from the car assisted by the Annan Coastguard team and Scottish Fire and Rescue Service, she was then handed into the care of the Ambulance Service for medical treatment, all crews were then released to return to their respective stations.

'Silloth - Maryport Bus'



The early summer sunshine in June was a welcome bonus for ship enthusiasts venturing out with their cameras. In fact, it could be classed as a heatwave the day cargo vessel WILSON ASTAKOS arrived at Silloth in flat calm conditions from Spain. The ship had set sail from the Mediterranean port of Sagunto eight days earlier with a full load of fertiliser. She had arrived ahead of schedule but unfortunately this coincided with the cycle of neap tides requiring a wait at Workington anchorage. Two days later there was sufficient depth of water for the pilot to bring the ship safely up the coast.

Built in 2010, the ship belongs to 'Wilson', the largest European short-sea shipping company. Based in Norway, it operates a fleet of 130 vessels. The company's ships are seen regularly at Silloth but this was the first visit for ASTAKOS. The ship is unusual in being registered in Luxembourg. Only a small number are registered in the taxfriendly landlocked country. Luxembourg has taken advantage of its economic strength to expand its maritime sector, developing a niche market for small freighters, dredgers and tugs on its register.

The light was exceptionally bright on the morning ASTAKOS was brought into Silloth Dock. Timing was carefully judged to coincide with high water. It was hoped that as the ship passed by, Luxembourg's rampant lion ensign would be flying in the breeze, however it was becalmed by the conditions. As the ship manoeuvred in the dock the captain was spotted directing operations wearing a striped top in exactly the same colours as the ensign, red, white and blue. Whether this was coincidence or a demonstration of patriotism he certainly looked very smart in position on the bridge.

Well, June was another reasonable month for Silloth, four vessels and no incidents. Three lots of fertiliser for Origin Fertilisers and a cargo of Clinker Ash to be added into the mix for Armstrong's concrete block manufacturing.

The Runner was chartered from Timberlink based in Scotland for the Clinker, the Runner is managed and run as a timber collection and delivery vessel based in Ayr and running up and down the Western Isles of Scotland collecting and delivering timber to and from various clients. Occasionally she has a short break in her run and bring the ash from Kilroot power station over to us here in Silloth for Armstrongs.

It was good to see a cargo coming from Klaipeda again, Eastern Europe has been very expensive and very quiet recently. The Wilson Astakos was a new vessel for us, coming up from Spain.

The port has a number of Navigational aids, buoys and lighthouses, one of which is currently out of order, namely East Cote lighthouse. Some may have noticed rot and degradation to the structure and the access ladder. We are currently attempting to decide what repairs and upgrades are necessary and as soon as we have completed deliberations will make a start on repairing the lighthouse. As the current local Pilot, I find it very useful when arriving at the port in the dark and most awkward not having it lit at the moment.

Works on the copings at the entrance to Marshall dock have now almost completed, now we are waiting for a stone mason to attend to fettle the edges into shape by cutting back the vertical face to match the lower wall's slope and then adding in the bullnose along the top outer edge. There are further coping works in progress at the entrance to the dock gate on the South side also, these being granite, not sandstone, which we are still awaiting delivery of some stone from the quarry.

July has started well with ship visits and we hope to have a few more in the next couple of weeks. Hopefully the summer will

return soon!






