Waste and Recycling Collection Dates Go Live Online

New Allerdale waste and recycling collection dates go live online

Updated waste and recycling collection dates for the former Allerdale area are now available.

On the buildup to changes to waste collection arrangements in the former Allerdale area

from week commencing 26 May, Cumberland Council is reminding residents to check their collection dates. Up to six weeks of collection information is available at one

Updated collection date information is available at www. cumberland.gov.uk/waste/binday.

Due to the changes that are taking place over the coming months, the council is unable to provide an annual calendar and is asking residents to continue to check their website for collection information as some collections dates may change for a small number of residents.

It is now too late for residents to request a replacement 180 litre bin if they currently have a 120 or 140 litre

Householders may also be eligible for an even larger or extra bin if they have

a large household, young children in nappies or your household produces extra waste due to medical needs. www.cumberland. gov.uk/waste/largerbin.

Cardboard/paper collections will increase from monthly to fortnightly from September 2025.

The council has reviewed their collection service, and the changes provide a more efficient service and make recycling easier.



Help Shape Our Library Services

Residents interested in helping to shape the future of Cumberland's Library Service are invited to a series of drop-in sessions taking place over the next few weeks.

Cumberland Council has recently launched a new programme of work, called Fit for the Future, which aims to futureproof the service, ensuring it meets the needs of local people going forward.

This stage of the project involves engaging with a range of stakeholders to gather their views through a series of public drop-in sessions and workshops with partner organisations. There is also a public survey which is open until July 4, 2025, at consult. cumberland.gov.uk/making-ourlibraries-fit-for-the-future.

One of the council's main aims is to continue to deliver library services that are welcoming and accessible to all and make the most of digital-based offerings which are becoming increasingly popular.

From next week drop-in sessions in each of Cumberland's libraries and Library Links will start giving people the chance to find out more about the project, ask questions, give their views and fill in the survey. The drop-ins are

open to both members and those residents who currently don't use

As a new authority with our own priorities and ambitions, as well as rapidly changing needs in our communities and user habits, it is right that we carry out this engagement to make sure that the service we will have in the future is fit for purpose."

Once all the information is gathered the council will then be able to make proposals on what Cumberland's Library Service could offer and how it can best be delivered. Residents and other stakeholders will be kept up to date with ongoing developments.

Foster carers share their stories in new short film

This Foster Care Fortnight (12th - 25th May), Cumbria Fostering is calling on local people to consider fostering by sharing the stories of our incredible foster carers in a new short film.

Led by the Fostering Network charity, Foster Care Fortnight is the annual campaign to raise the profile of fostering and show how it transforms lives.

This year's theme, "The Power of Relationships, celebrates the bonds that change lives - from the connection between a foster carer and a child, to the supportive network of professionals, peers, and families who all play a part in a child's journey. These relationships shape lives and open doors to brighter futures.

Foster carers Dan Bell and his partner Chris, from Barrow, are featured in our new film - talking about their fostering journey. Dan said: "We started fostering as 'connected family' foster carers for a member of our family, who we gave a home to up until he was 19. Since then we've become mainstream carers and have fostered several children over the past two years."

The couple, who currently care for two young siblings, have found fostering extremely fulfilling and would encourage others to follow in their footsteps. Dan said: "Just do it! If you have the time, space,

patience - it is worth it. You might have hard days but you have many good days and there's nothing you can't navigate with all the support out there; from family, friends, social workers and other carers. Why wouldn't you want to do it? We give it our all and we love it."

Another foster carer Gen Spencer, from south Cumbria, fosters a sibling group of two sisters, alongside her husband Neil. In the film she talks about the support and training they receive to help them develop the skills to manage any challenges. She said: "Neil and I have our own social worker who comes to see us at least once a month and there is loads of training and local support groups where you meet up with other carers, it's been brilliant."

Could you be the person who changes a child's future? Whether you're single, married, retired, or working, fostering is open to people from all walks of life. We provide full training, ongoing support, and have a network of more than 250 local foster carers who will walk this journey with

Friends of Silloth Green ~ Looking After Nature

With all our gardening activities we like to encourage insects and wildlife by providing suitable food & habitats.

We recently installed bird boxes in the wooded area of the Community Garden with different styles and locations to attract a range of birds.

Wrens don't like to be too high

up, Robins like open fronted boxes and Blue Tits prefer a small round pop hole, plus we have bird feeders which we top-up regularly.







We have created a number of Bug Hotels around the Garden and left a pile of wood to provide suitable 'homes' for beneficial insects. This is something you could easily do in your own garden or backyard.





It is also important to choose the right plants not just so they thrive in our conditions but also provide sources of food particularly early in the season. The Rosa Rugosa we planted last year is already in bloom and with the blossom on the trees is attracting beneficial insects.

But...not all insects are welcome we recently had to deal with an attack of Lily Beetle and aphids on the roses! We garden without the use of pesticides so they got squished or if you prefer you can spray them with a solution of water and washing up liquid!

May was a busy period for shipping at Silloth, however, all visitors were familiar names to ship enthusiasts as they were making repeat calls.

When this occurs it's often handy to dive into the archives to retrieve old photos. After considering several

possibilities, the general cargo vessel PHANTOM was chosen for this month's article. It's a case of once seen never forgotten, being memorable for both its green colour as well as its ghostly name.

Twelve years have passed since its last visit when it arrived on a bright summer's day and resulted in some colourful photos.

On that occasion PHANTOM was inbound from Ayr with a part load of fertiliser. Silloth often shares loads with nearby ports, in this case it was a bulk cargo originating from Morocco. The light load accounted for the ship appearing high in the water with a red stripe visible along the waterline. The layer of red is anti-fouling paint applied to help reduce marine growth and increase the ship's fuel efficiency. The ship was photographed as it lined up at the dock entrance. As it passed by it looked to make easy work of its entry to the dock in calm conditions.

PHANTOM is one of a large fleet operated by the German company 'Interscan Shipping. The ship's appearance has changed little in the twelve years since it last called at Silloth. One difference noted was a new port of registry painted on the stern; Gibraltar had been replaced by St. John's, the capital of the Caribbean Island of Antigua and Barbuda. This flag of convenience is often seen on ships sailing in European waters.

Several of PHANTOM's

sister ships appear in the same green livery but none have such an eerie name; the likes of PATRI, PERNILLE, and TIM have their origins in ancient languages and sound much less threatening.

In conclusion, it was fitting that on both occasions when PHANTOM visited Silloth, she slipped out of the dock on midnight tides under the cover of darkness bound for her next port of call.





Shipping at the Port of Silloth

Not a bad month for Silloth, four vessel calls and the weather has finally improved.

The Zapadnyy once again arrived and departed with a bit of a wriggle after discharging her Molasses cargo. She actually arrived in March but as we only account for the vessels on completion of cargo, this was accredited to April.

The Phantom arrived with a full cargo of Ammonium Nitrate for Origin and the following two vessels, Ruhrtal and Carolin G both had part cargoes for us split with Ayr.
