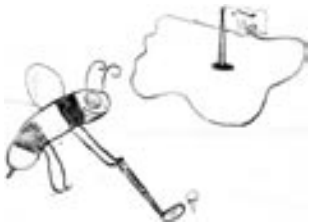

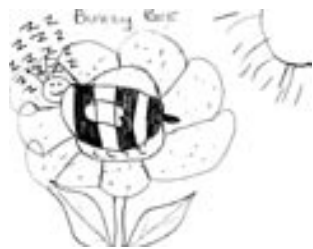

Tip for the Top

Perfect Curls

The way your hair is cut will govern how the curls form. If you have one length hair, you will find the weight not your hair may pull your curls out.

I like to see curly hair cut with a heavier base line and then lots of choppy layers to give the hair natural movement. Some stylists use texturing scissors to take weight out of really thick hair, promoting curl.

The room will be open

for staging between 8:

30am – 10am. Judging

begins at 10.15 prompt.

No entries will be accepted

after judging has begun.

Only stewards and judges

are allowed in room while

judging takes place. Judges

decision is final.

Points are awarded as

follows

1st = 3 points

2nd = 2 points

3rd = 1 point.

Trophies are awarded to the

person with most points in

that section. No Trophy for

Misc. section but the points

count towards 'overall

points in show'. There are

trophies for those who are

placed 1st, 2nd, & 3rd in the

X-Stitch class and a trophy

for the person with most

points overall. The show

closes to the public at 4pm,

exhibitors are asked not to

remove their exhibits before

this time, those doing so

will forfeit any prize money

and points. Trophies will be

presented at 4pm ish! Prize

money is:

1st = £2.50

2nd = £1.50

3rd = £1.

Entry costs are:

Classes 1- 9 – 10p

All other classes are 20p

While all reasonable care

exhibits are displayed at the

owners risk. The committee

will not be held responsible

for any loss or damage to

any article staged.
