Anyone wanting a free electric blanket safety check via Cumbria Trading Standards can leave their blankets (name label attached) at Pennine View or drop them off on 1st September and ACNWC will pass them to Trading Standards for checking.

Facilities at the college include an auditorium, classrooms and sixty bedrooms allowing crew members to stay on site and therefore save the charity £1Million a year in accommodation costs.

The RNLI depends on voluntary contributions from the public to continue its sea rescue service. By complementing vital local training, the Lifeboat College will help the RNLI save more lives at sea.
