Fluoridation in Cumbria

CUMBRIANS

1] The fluoride, which is introduced at Cornhow and Ennerdale water treatment plants by United Utilities is not naturally occurring fluoride. It is Hexafluorosilic Acid, sourced as a byproduct of the fertiliser industry, and contains small amounts of lead, mercury, arsenic and beryllium. It has neither been tested or registered as fit for human consumption.

2] Fluoride cannot be removed from water unless you have installed a reverse osmosis unit.

3] Fluoride
accumulates in the
body. 50% of your daily
fluoride intake will be
stored in the bones.
It may take several
decades before any
signs of deterioration
are evident. Fluoride
has been linked with
many health concerns
including thyroid
disorders. Babies
and those with low
immune systems will be

particularly vulnerable to this chemical.

4] Fluoride added to the water increases the local levels and risks. We suggest avoiding fluoridated toothpaste and not drinking tea. When our group tested 30 local people for fluoride levels those using both these products showed high levels of fluoride intake.

5] What does the scientific research say about fluoride? The independent scientific review undertaken by this government in 2000 to resolve years of disagreement found poor quality research over forty years meant it could reach no conclusion as to its safety or effectiveness. However, it identified 48% dental fluorosis [excess fluoride] in the population of artificially fluoridated areas.

6] Dental fluorosis indicates an excessive intake of fluoride. If there is an excess at a very young age then it results in a discoloration of the surface of the adult teeth. This can vary from white flecks to brown/yellow pitting. Long term fluoride excess can lead to

skeletal fluorosis [bones become brittle and prone to breaks].

Fluoride is added to the water in an attempt to control early tooth decay. Its effectiveness is questionable and adding it to the water is a clumsy, autocratic way of medicating people which takes no account of personal health issues or rights.

It is unlikely that the target group, young children with tooth decay, are even drinking the water. Early, high decay is an indicator of

a sugar rich diet which includes bottled drinks such as Cola's etc.
Decay should be tackled through education about poor diet and delivering NHS dental services.
