

It brought back many memories of α bygone age. In the audience was Mr Jimmy Lister, who drove the last train to Silloth on the 6th September 1964, he enjoyed the show along with Mrs Mary Story who was crossing keeper at Blackdyke from 1952 to 1962.

Johns' show of 200 slides started with Port Carlisle Canal, which was quickly turned into a railway. The Silloth line was an extension

from Drumburgh.
