There has been a general up-turn in criminal activity in Silloth over the past few weeks. There have been a number of incidents where cars have had their windows smashed or their tyres slashed. Three arrests have been made to date.

This up-turn has been seen on the various caravan parks. In recent weeks contractors' vehicles have had windows smashed, a guest reported having a mobile phone stolen and in another incident a £3,000 trials type motorcycle was stolen.



Solway Lightship Continued

Further to Mr Alex Smith's photograph in the last issue, Olive Wood said: "Mr Smith took the recent photograph of the correct position of the Solway Lightship's last resting place. Three years of its last years being spent as a tea ship, before being broken up by the owners during 1929. In the original newspaper cutting by Prof. Denis Perram (taken from the Carlisle Journal 14th Nov 1998). The Lightship was finally beached at Skinburness in 1920. The brass bell was sold to Silloth Golf Club. Is it still used as a warning bell? The anchor rests outside the R.N.L.I. Station, Silloth." Mrs Glaister remembers that when she was quite young, people were able to buy ice cream from the ship, when she had some pennies she went and purchased an ice cream cone, she had to climb a ladder to get on board. When she got home to East Cote Farm her father gave her a terrible telling off for going there so she never went again! Mrs Simpson remembers that there was a tea room on the ship for about three years before it was broken up and that she used to play on the wreck around 1926/1927. I have been told there is a book in the Library which cannot be removed giving more details about Silloth from the 1800's onwards.






