There has been a general up-turn in criminal activity in Silloth over the past few weeks. There have been a number of incidents where cars have had their windows smashed or their tyres slashed. Three arrests have been made to date.

This up-turn has been seen on the various caravan parks. In recent weeks contractors' vehicles have had windows smashed, a guest reported having a mobile phone stolen and in another incident a £3,000 trials type motorcycle was stolen.

On a more positive note a man has been charged with the 13 break-ins at caravans that took place during the month of April. He was resident in Silloth at the time of the offences.

Dog Fouling

A Maryport man has been prosecuted by Allerdale Borough Council for failing to clean up after his dog fouled.

Steven Woodburn, of Wallace Lane, Maryport, was fined £75 and £50 costs by West Allerdale Magistrates on Tuesday 17 May 2005 after he failed to pay a fixed penalty fine of £50.

The Court heard that, on the morning of 16 February 2005, Allerdale's Environmental Wardens witnessed Mr Woodburn's black and white Staffordshire Bull Terrier fouling on the grassed area of Wallace Lane. Mr Woodburn failed to clean up after his dog.

A fixed penalty notice was hand delivered to Mr Woodburn's home but was not paid. Despite a reminder letter being sent to Mr Woodburn on 11 March, the fixed penalty remained unpaid.

Mr Woodburn was not present at the hearing.

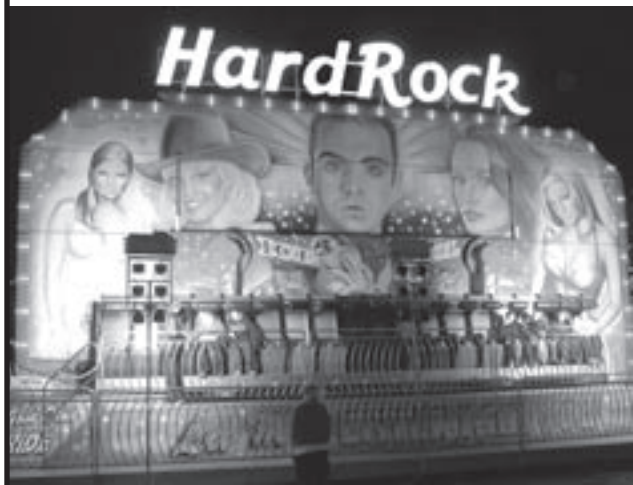

To date, the national take up rate is less than 5% and many licensees do not realise that they must apply for two licences before November 7th 2005. They have until August 6th to apply for a conversation or face obtaining a fresh qualification to satisfy a new application. Both personal and premises licences must be in place after November 7th in order to trade under the new system.

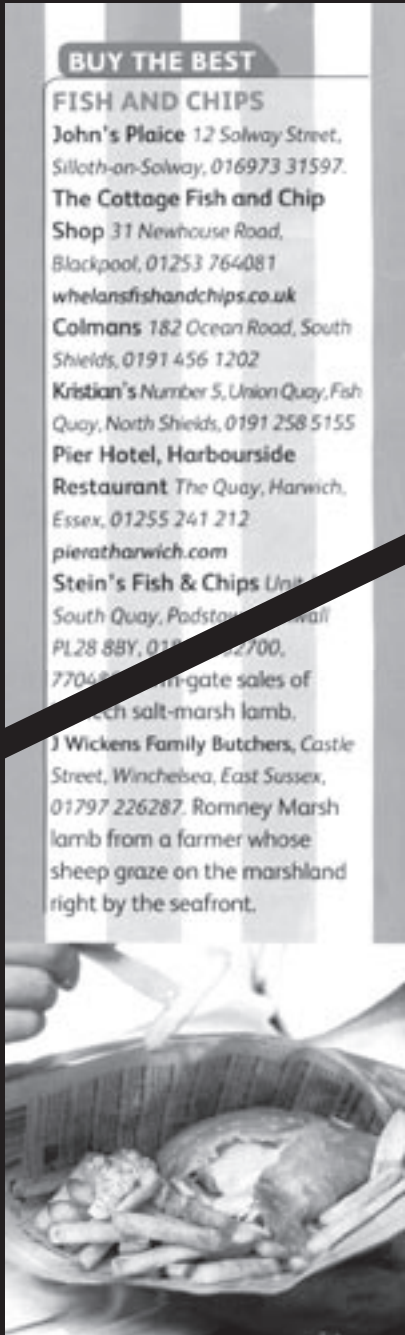

Solway Lightship Continued



Old photo provided by Mrs Glaister shows skeleton with two prominent masts.

Further to Mr Alex Smith's photograph in the last issue, Olive Wood said: "Mr Smith took the recent photograph of the correct position of the Solway Lightship's last resting place. Three years of its last years being spent as a tea ship, before being broken up by the owners during 1929. In the original newspaper cutting by Prof. Denis Perram (taken from the Carlisle Journal 14th Nov 1998). The Lightship was finally beached at Skinbarness in 1920. The brass bell was sold to Silloth Golf Club. Is it still used as a warning bell? The anchor rests outside the R.N.L.I. Station, Silloth."

Mrs Glaister remembers that when she was quite young, people were able to buy ice cream from the ship, when she had some pennies she went and purchased an ice cream cone, she had to climb a ladder to get on board. When she got home to East Cote Farm her father gave her a terrible telling off for going there so she never went again!

Mrs Simpson remembers that there was a tea room on the ship for about three years before it was broken up and that she used to play on the wreck around 1926/1927.

I have been told there is a book in the Library which cannot be removed giving more details about Silloth from the 1800's onwards.

The Bounty

The “Grand Turk” had originally been booked by the Carnegie Theatre, (Allerdale Borough Council) to visit Maryport for a week, during which time she was to be re-named “Bounty” and become the setting for a re-enactment of the well known mutiny of 1789.
Because of difficulties anticipated in entering Maryport, due to the narrow margin of water depth available and the fresh wind conditions, the port of Silloth was asked at short notice if the ship could come here instead. The request was readily accepted,

thus giving the people of Silloth and visitors, a wonderful opportunity to see this unique vessel, to step on board and look around her decks and see exhibitions of life afloat during the Napoleonic era.
She was open to the public daily from 10am to 6pm, during which time, several entertaining performances were given, of the “mutiny” story by professional actors and musicians. Demonstrations were also given of the loading procedure and firing of a naval cannon. The blast of gunfire could be heard regularly at two hourly

"Grand Turk" alias "Bounty" was built in 1997 at Marmaris, Turkey, using local labour. Constructed from timber, her hull is made from Oroko, an African hardwood, whilst her mast sections are made of Douglas Fir from the Forest of Dean. Costing then £3.5m, she is in fact, externally, a true replica

of the British 6th Rate, 22 gun frigate "Blanford", of 1795.

With a crew of 28, she is measured at 314 Gross Registered Tonnes, she actually weighs approximately 750 tonnes, has an overall length of 43 metres, a beam of 10.2 metres and a maximum draft of 3.25 metres. As well as her three masts, nine and a half miles of rigging and



her sails, she is propelled by two Kelvin TSA-8 Diesel engines and a

small bow thruster unit, to help her manoeuvre in light winds and in

confined waters.

She sailed from Silloth on Saturday 18th June, to

Maryport, where she was again open to the public for two days. She then headed south, to take a major role of honour in the "Trafalgar 200" event, (the 200th anniversary of the Battle of Trafalgar) at Spithead anchorage, off Portsmouth Dockyard.

There will be a Queen's Review of 182 British and foreign warships on 28th June, when the "Grand Turk" will take on the role of Lord Nelson's flagship "Victory", inspecting the assembled fleet as she sails up and down the lines of today's modern warships.

At Silloth, large sailing ships are becoming rather like buses. We don't see one for over 80 years, then two come along within three years of each other! ("Phoenix" 2002).

The team wish to thank their Manager Donald Young and his assistant Mike Graves for all their hard work and encouragement throughout the season, it is much appreciated.

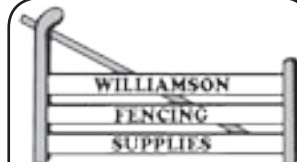
Under 15's Football

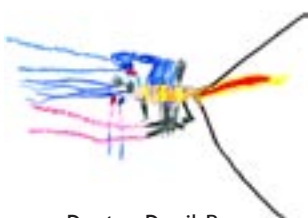
