

North Allerdale Partnership Secures £1,000,000 Funding

The North Allerdale Partnership (NAP) received confirmation (subject to contract) from the Northwest **Regional Development** Agency (NWRDA) for a scheme of funding for three years. The Agency will be investing over £1,000,000 with NAP including £700,000 towards regeneration activity in the North Allerdale area that will include:

• A North Allerdale Commercial Facelift

Scheme

• A Resource Centre in Aspatria predated by a piece of development work to identify a work base/training area – Aspatria Cinema Initiative

• A Training & Support Centre in Wigton – The Gathering Place

• Public Realm Works in Silloth

• A Mini Masterplan for Silloth Dock Area

This funding forms part of the overall £1 million that NWRDA earmarked to each of the Market Towns Initiatives. A preliminary expenditure grant of just under £70,000 was approved in the summer of 2004 to allow for two pieces of feasibility work and a master planning exercise to commence. These included:

One has to remember, of course, that this overall approval is only the first step in a long process that will involve a lot of hard work. Each project and scheme, whether in Aspatria, Wigton, Silloth, or hinterland, will need to submit further bids and performance plans for approval, in order to draw down the cash for each phase of development.

NWRDA has helped us considerably in formulating this bid and throughout the process we have been helped and supported by Allerdale Council's Regeneration Team'.

Port of Silloth Exhibition

AN ILLUSTRATED EXHIBITION ON THE HISTORY OF THE PORT OF SILLOTH

On Saturday 30th and Sunday 31st July 2005, the Harbour Master of Associated British Ports, (Silloth), Captain Chris Puxley, presented an exhibition covering the history of Silloth Docks. This weekend event was given as a local contribution towards the "SEABRITAIN 2005" celebrations being held around the country.

The exhibition followed two special ship visits earlier in the year. The Royal Navy sent HMS "BITER" for a successful two day stop-over in March and the replica 1790's frigate "GRAND TURK", reenacting the "BOUNTY" mutiny, paid a five day visit in June. Both ships were open to the public, who took full advantage

this ever-growing port archive, many residents and shipping enthusiasts, in and around Silloth, plus Carlisle's Tullie House museum and

of this opportunity to step aboard and explore these interesting vessels. Held in the ballroom of the Golf Hotel in Silloth, the "Illustrated Exhibition" was based around an extensive collection of photographs, letters, documents and newspaper items, supplemented by descriptive text, all collected and placed in chronological order by Chris Puxley. Details dated back to the early 1800's when basic dock facilities first began to appear in the upper reaches of the Solway Firth, and continue right up to the present day. In addition to the seventeen volumes of

the County Archive Office, loaned paintings, pictures, documents and artefacts, all of which greatly enhanced the exhibition. Silloth **RNLI** lifeboat station, the local RNLI souvenir shop, H.M. Coastguard and the Solway Firth Partnership, along with port related businesses, were given the opportunity to take part in this event and made a significant contribution to the colourful and interesting displays. Also on show were several editions of Admiralty charts of the Solway Firth, dating from 1837 right up to the charts in current use by modern mariners. A large map of



Europe and North Africa illustrated the wide range and location of ports that have traded with the port of Silloth over the near 150 years of its existence. It was in fact on 16th July 1855, that an Act of Parliament permitted the construction of a railway link and a dock to be built at this remote location. With the railway link to Carlisle completed, trading from the newly built pier began in 1857 and the "Marshall Dock" was completed and opened in 1859.

Following a disaster in 1879 when the port entrance and the dock gates collapsed, briefly trapping about twenty vessels within the dock, a second and larger dock was excavated behind that existing facility, completed in 1885 and imaginatively called the "New Dock". In 1887, the biscuit manufacturing Carr family opened a newly built flour mill alongside this dock. That same basic infrastructure remains today and it is within the "New Dock" that all the commercial activity of the port is

undertaken. ABP's Short Sea Ports Director, John Fitzgerald and the ABP N.W. Ports Manager, Nick Ridehalgh hosted a celebration dinner and private viewing of the

exhibition for invited guests on the Saturday evening at the Golf Hotel. All the hard work of compiling and assembling the exhibitio was fully rewarded

by the large number of visitors attending, the keen interest they

showed in the items on display and the kind comments expressed to me throughout and after the event. A small entrance fee raised over £620 for Cumbrian charities and worthy causes, all of which will be administered and distributed by Silloth on Solway Rotary Club.

Bowness, Holme Abbey, Gilcrux, Caldbeck, Kirkbride, Kirkbampton, Waverton, Westward, Silloth, Wigton, Dundraw, Holme Low, Allonby, Westnewton, Aikton, Aspatria, Woodside, Sebergham, Bromfield, Thursby, Hayton and Mealo, Ireby, Plumbland, Boltons, Allhallows, Holme East Weaver, Bothel and Threapland, Holme St. Cuthbert, Oughterside and Allerby, Blennerhasset and Torpenhow.

Time is limited, all works must be completed by February 28th, so to take advantage of this offer you must move fast. Don't miss this opportunity to improve the value of your property and the look of the whole neighbourhood with the benefit of a 50% grant.

Works eligible under the scheme: **Replacement windows** and doors **Replacement rainwater** goods Repainting and rerendering New / improved signage Installation of security equipment General repairs to shop fronts Joinery Details: Properties must be situated within eligible parishes. Grants are only available for external works to the frontages of commercial properties. The award of grants is at the discretion of the funding partners. Grants will normally be made to cover the cost of 50% of eligible works up to a maximum grant of £2,000 and are not awarded retrospectively. Applicants are required to supply two itemised quotes for all proposed works from bona-fide contractors. It is the responsibility of the applicant to obtain all

relevant permissions that may be required for all proposed works.



Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Can I apply for a Facelift grant for a residential or community property? No. Facelift grants are only available for commercial properties.

Q: I am a tenant and do not own the property, can I apply for a Facelift grant?

Yes, however, you will need to provide written consent for all proposed works from the owner of the property. Q: Can I apply for a Facelift grant for work that has already been completed? No. Grants are not awarded retrospectively.

Q: What type of works may be eligible for grant assistance?

External works to the property frontage, such as replacement windows/doors, new signage, painting, improvements to rainwater infrastructure and the installation of security equipment are eligible for grant assistance. Grant assistance is not available for internal works.

Q: Will I need planning permission? Planning permission may be required if changes are not like-for-like. It is the responsibility of the applicant to obtain all relevant permissions that may be required for all proposed works.

Q: Are VAT costs eligible for assistance under the Facelift scheme?

No. The level of grant is calculated as a percentage of costs exclusive of VAT. Q: Can I undertake any of the work myself?

Yes, however, grant monies will only be made available to help cover the cost of materials in this instance. Grant monies inspections by housing renewal and building control officers, before and after the completion of any works. Planning Permission may be required for works that are not like-for-like. All works must have been completed by no later than Feb 28th 2006.

are not available for personal labour costs. Q: What is the definition of a 'bona-fide' contractor?

The term 'bona-fide' has been included here to highlight that any contractors approached for quotes cannot be related to the tenant or the owner of the property. Any contractor approached must have the skills, expertise and experience necessary to complete all works to a suitably highstandard. A final inspection by Allerdale Borough Council will serve to confirm that all works undertaken were as proposed and were completed to a high-standard. Q: Can I use a different contractor to the one specified by Allerdale Borough Council following the submission of the original quotes?

Yes, however, if this contractor is more expensive than the contractor specified by Allerdale Borough Council, then the original grant offer will not be increased. Alternatively, if a cheaper contractor is chosen to complete the works, then the grant offer will be proportionally reduced in line with the new costs involved. Q: What happens if the final cost of the work is different from the original estimate?

If the final cost of the work is greater than the original estimate (for example, some contractors will not include the cost of scaffolding in an initial quote), then the original grant offer will not be increased. Alternatively, if the final cost of the works is less than the original estimate, then the grant offer will be proportionally reduced in line with the new costs involved.





Associated **British Ports** (ABP), the UK's largest and leading ports group, has launched a summer safetyawareness campaign to warn children of the dangers they face if they swim in the

Out of concern for the communities that surround its ports, ABP is spreading the message that, not only is swimming in the docks illegal, it can also result in serious injury or even death.

As the heatwave during the summer holidays inevitably heralds an increase in children attempting to swim wherever they can, ABP decided to provide local schools with 'hardhitting' posters and

leaflets that warn of the hazards of this activity before they broke up for the summer holiday. The information was provided to some 150 schools within a five-mile radius of the Company's ports.

Bo Lerenius, ABP's Group Chief Executive, explains: "We are trying to prevent behaviour that is a serious cause of concern for everyone involved, not just for parents, but also for everyone working at the port."

He added: "The children must understand that swimming in the dock is acutely dangerous - the water is deep, cold and unpredictable. It is not like a swimming pool, with lifeguards and safety systems in place and it is potentially contaminated with discharges from ships and industrial processes, and Weil's disease from rats in the water. The only way to be safe is to avoid it altogether."

What is Pneumococcal disease? Pneumococcal disease is caused by the bacterium Streptococcus pneumonia. It is the most common cause of pneumonia and it can cause a number of other serious illnesses, including septicaemia and meningitis, which can be fatal. This risk increases substantially after the age of 65. If you are over 65 years of age you will shortly be receiving an invitation to attend the surgery to have a Pneumococcal vaccination. Unlike the flu vaccination the Pneumococcal vaccination can be given all year round.
