The two day event started off with fantastic weather and racing on the Saturday with two heats being raced by each class. The day did not go without its hitches though with several green flags handed out for driving on the tyre markers including Junior Driver Gavin Marks in SL22, another junior driver to receive a green flag was young Lee Birks in SL18, Anthony Bickley in SL614 and also Keith Bowrey in SL52. A black

flag was also given to stock hatch driver SL600 for causing the race to be stopped. Unfortunately for Will Ward driving SL25 his car spun out, rolled over and then landed on its four wheels again, thankfully after being looked at by the St. John's Ambulance crew Will was fine as was the car.

Class 2 saw all three places go to away drivers with 1st for Yorkshire Dales and second for a Leewood driver.

Class 3 saw two wins with Stewart Lewthwaite from Frizington in SL3 gaining Second and Aspatria's Neil Barnes in SL68 gaining a well deserved third place.

Class 5 saw a first place trophy awarded to Robert Pattinson in SL87.

Class 6 second place went to SL94 Michael Macintosh and third place to another Solway member SL106.

Class 7 saw the first class to be won entirely by Solway members with SL100 Stewart Lewthwaite gaining first, even though it was only the second time he has had this car out on the race track and keeps putting it through fences, Mark Nuggent from Carlisle in SL51 gaining second and third place going to Scotland's David Pagan driver of SL41.

Class 8 was a very closely run race with second place going top SL80 Phil Talbot and third place to SL50 Steve Hartley.

Class 9 driver Richard Telford stormed home in SL8 to gain first place.

Class 10 was won by a visiting driver from York. Class 11 saw Whitehaven's Lin Cunningham coming home with a trophy for third place in SL12 after being piped at the post by Young Yorkshire Dales driver Lindsey Knott and another Dales driver Angie Hilton.

Class 12 saw young Debbie Alford in SL156 coming home with a first place trophy after just entering into this class.

Class 13 was won by drivers again from Yorkshire Dales club.

Class 14 saw two wins for the cars SL177 which was being driven by a lady from an away club and second place for Sue Carlisle's Burgess in SL33.

Juniors A final saw Carlisle's Gavin Marks in SL22 gaining first position with the winner from the B final Jonathon Biagi gaining joint third - well done.

Juniors B final was the second class of the day to be cleaned up by Solway drivers with Young Jonathon Biagi SL85 storming home for first place, Lee Birks from Maryport driving SL18 in Second and third but by no means least newcomer John Brough in SL256.

Stock special A final saw a third place trophy heading Solway's way in the form of SL177 Peter Cobb. Stock special B final was dominated by Leewood drivers.

Stock Hatch saw a fantastically close race from all the drivers with a few near misses but nevertheless resulted in two trophies for Solway members with SL626 Kevin Brough gaining a well deserved first place and Cleator Moor's Trevor Payne in SL678 gaining a good second place.
