She was invited to London after Cumbria came second in Britain in Bloom Competition, and met celebrity gardener Monty Don.

She also raised £24,000 for charity while Mayor and her worst job was abseiling down the civic centre on her second attempt, as the rope proved to be too short on the first attempt. She opened a conference for the Rotarians at the Sands Centre and was invited to make the opening speech. In her speech she said, as Mayor she had sworn an oath to patrol the castle walls and keep out the invading Scots. Instead, she was welcoming over a thousand Scots into Carlisle.

## Bogus Callers

Allerdale Borough Council is asking residents in the borough to beware of bogus salesmen following reports of unscrupulous so-called workmen offering to carry out household repairs.

On several occasions, members of the public were pressurised by these callers to have work done to their properties that they didn't want. The Council would advise all householders not to employ cold callers however plausible they may seem. The West Cumbria Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership advises to think Stop, Chain and Check:

Stop – Are you expecting anybody? Do they have an appointment?

Chain – Secure the door bar or chain before opening the door

Check – Ask for and double-check the caller's ID. And if you are in any doubt, don't let them in.

## Community Fund Birthday

The Allerdale Community Fund reached its fifth birthday recently and has benefited over 26,000 people during that time!

The Allerdale Community Fund was launched in August 2001. It was initiated by Allerdale Borough Council and is administered by the Cumbria Community Foundation. Over five years the Allerdale Community Fund has grown to help many people. The statistics over the past five years are: Total value of grants: £411,375
Number of grants made: 375, Average grant: £1,097

Number of grants made: 375, Average grant: £1,097 Community groups supported: 719 Volunteers supported: 4,297

Participants / beneficiaries: 26,691 People trained: 347, Jobs safeguarded: 45 People employed: 87, Community events supported: 53 Community facilities supported: 101

The Council wanted to create a grants fund which would be as accessible as possible to voluntary and community groups, and which would help deliver long term benefits to local communities. The Council's aim was to support small, grass roots volunteer based groups and so the Allerdale Community Fund was born.

The Allerdale Community Fund Panel, which awards the grants, meets regularly, so that groups are not delayed. Urgent and small grants (up to £500) can be made by the Chair and Grants Officer. The fastest grant was 58 minutes from enquiry to approval.
