

The entire story except the first few lines were written by the children themselves and the artists worked with the children using a range of different disciplines from dance and music and pictures as well as writing.

The Solway Saga involved up to 200 children and was performed by some of



the artists on July 22nd in the Solway Coast Discovery Centre. Silloth. The children's work was used as the basis for the performance and everyone who took part was invited to attend.
