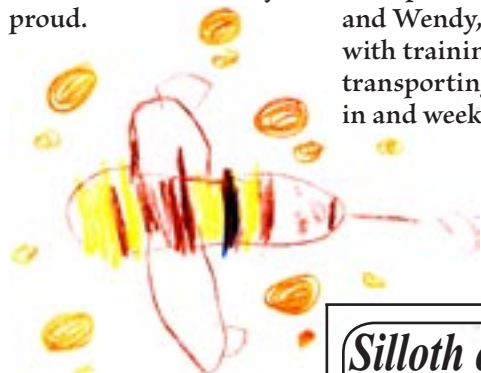
Bethany and Megan Wise deserve congratulation after completing their first competitive season in athletics. They are both members of Ellenborough Athletics Club in Maryport.
