Mayors Report

March. Letters included one from Home Housing regarding the maintenance of the seats on Esk Street. A letter asked for the Town Councils view on the proposed Wind Farm at Parkhead Farm. This is outside the Parish, however the Councillors are against the proposals.

It was agreed the Vintage Rally could use the Green.

Change of use of 14/16 Eden Street and the erection of a childrens centre at the school were approved. Development of land at Solway Lido for residential units and the development of the Skinburness Hotel site were refused by Allerdale.

The AONB Ranger Service now has 180 volunteers.

A request for financial assistance for a museum entitled 'Soldiers in Silloth' will be considered.

Vandalism of the Eden Street football changing rooms has cost the ratepayers even more.

April. The Chairman announced that he had welcomed the officers and crew of 'HMS Biter' to Silloth. On departure from the town they all expressed their thanks for the reception they were given.

Both the Chairman and Vice Chairman attended the Junior School choir at Distington along with pupils from other schools, a lovely night was had by all.

The following correspondence was dealt with amongst others, a letter seeking the town Councils support in asking the County Highways to attend urgently to the flooding problems which occur on Skinburness Road every time it rains, also the constant flooding of the Marsh Road near the Wath and the state of the road at the same location.

Reports were given from the Primary School, where the head teacher has returned after a serious illness, Silloth Tourist Action Group reported their brochure is due out shortly and will be distributed around the North of England, a Food Fair is to be held on the Green on the 5th August, the Regeneration Partnership were progressing and hoped to obtain funds to tidy up the area between the RNLI and the entrance to the docks.

The Town Clerk requested reports from members for the Annual Town Report, which we must provide by law and which should be available around the town in early May prior to the Annual Town Meeting.

Application for financial assistance were received from, Soldiers in Silloth, Silloth Open Door Group and Silloth Festivals Ltd, towards training official door staff for the Beer Festival. Following discussions funding was agreed to all three groups.

A request was received from Christ Church for permission to hold a service on the Green on the 6th May, weather permitting, as part of the Walk Cumbria event.
