Mayors Report

September 2007

Several events were attended by the Mayor over the past two months, a Civil Service for the Mayor of Wigton, the Kite Festival, a Civil Service in Christ Church attended by the Mayor's from Copeland/ Maryport/Wigton/ Aspatria/ Workington, along with the Deputy Mayor of Allerdale who all expressed concern regarding the poor attendance by Silloth Town Councillors.

The two page Police Report highlighted several matters for discussion, one of particular concern was from residents of the Crofts, motorists speeding through the estate, this is jointly being discussed by the Police, officers from Cumbria Highways and Allerdale Borough Council.

The future of the Youth Club was to be considered but will now be discussed at the next meeting when all parties can be present.

Correspondence received: Allerdale Borough Council Clean Neighbourhood & Environment Act 2005. Concerns regarding the gates within the sea wall on Skinburness Road this has been passed to A.B.C. as it is their responsibility. A letter seeking help for the restoration of the Carillon bells within

Christ Church. A letter seeking support for Silloth Community Craft Show.

Planning applications dealt with were noted.

Reports by representatives and outside bodies included: A new area has been surfaced at the Primary School during the holidays. Joint Advisory Committee advising the A.O.N.B. AGM which is being held on 14th September. Regeneration said they are awaiting the preliminary H.L.F. bid and that consultants have been in the town talking to locals already. Health matters, have received a donation of £500 from the S.O.S. Charity Shop towards the pensioners tea party at the beer festival.

Allerdale councillors state that things as usual are slow to change and that several complaints have been received regarding the public toilets, these are to be taken up with the authority.

Concern is growing regarding the condition of the equipment in Eden Street playing field, i.e. the fort and several items are nearing the end of their expected life. Prices are being sourced with a view to replacement but this does not come cheap, however the site does get a lot of use but constant vandalism does cost the ratepayers of Silloth a large amount each year.
