Clean It Up!

As part of the 'Clean It Up' campaign Allerdale Borough Council are asking businesses to check that the disposal of their trade waste is carried out properly and legally.

Every year councils in England spend millions of pounds clearing up rubbish that is dumped by people posing as legitimate waste disposers. Everyone has a legal 'duty of care' for the trade waste they produce, which means that they must take all reasonable steps to keep waste secure. When they don't, not only do they break the law, they make it more likely that littering, fly-tipping and pollution will take place.


The Council attended 1,130 reported incidents of fly tipping last year, costing the council tax payer £57,522. A small but significant proportion of that cost is due to businesses not disposing of their waste legally and effectively.

To ensure businesses are not using unlicensed disposal sites or flytipping waste, which is a nuisance or a healthrisk to residents, the

Council is stepping up its checks on Waste Transfer Notices from businesses and other producers of trade waste within the borough. The introduction of the Clean Neighbourhoods and **Environment Act allows** fixed penalty notices to be issued to businesses failing to produce a Waste Transfer Notice.

The Council recognises that many businesses, from shops and take-aways to tradesmen and factories, may not understand, or even neglect, their legal responsibilities for waste. The Council has embarked on an initiative to contact businesses in a variety of locations or sectors where waste management is an issue and is advising local businesses to:

- Know their waste management 'duty of care'
- Store waste securely to prevent escape or scavenging
- Double-check that the person taking waste away is an 'authorised carrier'
- Complete 'waste transfer notices' and keep copies for inspection.
