Gladys was the delegate for the NFWI AGM at the Albert Hall on 3rd June and gave her report. She enjoyed the meeting and the Resolution 'Honey Bees play a vital role in the pollination of food crops and in our environment. In the view of concerns about the accelerating decline in the UK honey bee population, this meeting urges HM Government to increase funding for research into Bee health' was passed by 61,644 for and 37 against. NFWI Chair Fay Mansell was stepping down this year and gave her last address to the conference urging members to be proud of the WI and reminding everyone the more you put in the more you get

Dr. John Low CBE talked of the work of Charity Aid Foundation who were sponsors of the meeting. Tim Lovatt from the Beekeepers spoke for the resolution and Dr. Clare Calvel against. Maureen Lipman was the Guest Speaker and was her usual hilarious self, though ended talking

passionately about Aung San Suu Kyi who is being held under house arrest in Burma. Ruth Bond gave an update on campaigns then after a picnic lunch in Hyde Park Eco Team Leaders and Love Food Champions were presented to members. Presentations were made of the Lady Denman Cup and Elizabeth Bell Trophy. The next speaker was Jonathon Wild CBO of Taylors Tea who gave a very amusing account of his travels around various Federations. Anne Harrison gave an update on the work at Denman College and urged all members to come and try a course there. The new Board of Trustees was introduced and first on the platform was our own Pauline Bibby. Eve Pollard spoke of her journalist career and is an admirer of the WI and the influence we have. The day ended with Richard Stilgoe and the Orpheus Centre Apprentices performing music and songs of their own composition. They were wonderful and finished off a very enjoyable day.

The Fun Run Chair had phoned to thank the WI for all their help with the teas over the years.

Elinor Roper collected bulb Orders and Freda asked if there was any interest in a trip to the Lakeland Rose Show/ Kendal on 11th July. Gladys then introduced Mr. Tony Britton to talk about Orchids. He was a lecturer in Engineering at Carlisle College but in 1992 he and a friend became interested in orchids. Their first purchase of a flask of orchids was a disaster as they all died but they tried again and he now has a glasshouse containing over 300 species of orchid. He had brought six different types with him and told us how to keep them alive and hopefully get them to flower again next year. He told us the worst thing to give them is too much water so let them dry out thoroughly before watering them again and do not let them stand in water. Many can go for up to two weeks without being watered again. None like bright sun and prefer a cool light position. Some like it at 50° but some prefer 60° and he showed us the type which grow from a bulb but warned, they only grow a bulb each year and need to be very big before being split as they need to be in groups of at least three to be re-potted. He then showed us the different potting mediums to use and showed us some endangered species, which need special care. He had

50th Anniversary of the Recreation Hall

Silloth and District Pensioners' Association to Celebrate 50 years in the Recreation Hall on 5th September 2009

Silloth and District Pensioners Recreation Hall was bought by Mr Jimmy Blake (Kenny Blake's father) from Silloth Airfield and donated to the Association. Permission was sought from the Parish Council, to establish the Recreation Hall on its present site, overlooking the children's playing field.

The Committee applied, with success, to the George VI Memorial Fund and received £175. Work then began for the Silloth and District Pensioners to own their own hall, which they could use as a drop-in centre. The foundation and base were laid by Mr Gilbert Harrison and the hall assembled and re-erected by Mr Tom Underwood from North House. The Pensioners **Association Committee** raised funds for the interior decoration and furnishing and the floor was covered with lino purchased from the Cooperative Store. Mr C. Mackay donated the painted notice board.

On 5th September, in front of a large crowd seated outside the Hall; Mr G A Hodgson, the Committee Chairman, said that it was a happy moment in the history of their association now that they had their own

quarters, thanks to Mr Blake's gift of the building, the good work of the Committee and help from the King George VI Memorial Fund. It was going to take a good deal of upkeep and he asked everyone present to dig deeply into their pockets to make the Opening Day Gift Sale a success.

After a prayer of dedication, offered by retired Presbyterian Minister, Rev. Sidney Bainbridge; the Hall was declared open by Mr Jimmy Blake, who said that he hoped that all the old people of the town would use it and that it would bring them much pleasure and enjoyment. In appreciation of his gift; Mr Blake was presented with an inscribed cigarette lighter, by Mr G.A. Hodgson, the Committee Chairman. Mrs Blake was presented with a bouquet of flowers by Linda Armstrong, granddaughter of Treasurer Mr F Armstrong (daughter of Norman and Doreen Armstrong).

Mr John Holliday (chairman of the Parish Council) paid tribute to his colleagues on the council, for their part in the organisation of such a big asset to the town. He thanked Mr and Mrs Blake for their extremely generous gift and said that he hoped he could persuade the council to improve the very rough path down to

Mr W Johnston, headmaster of Silloth School, spoke on behalf of the committee and said that it was a Red Letter Day for the Association. It had not been an easy task and they appreciated the practical help given in kind, cash, and voluntary labour and gave special thanks given to the Ladies committee.

The minutes from 1959–1964 have, unfortunately disappeared, so all information about those

early years has come from a newspaper report in the Cumberland News and from members at the

When the hall was up and running, the first caretaker, Mr Armstrong opened up at 10am. He was paid £1 per week plus a weekly National Insurance stamp of 1/7d.


There were comfortable chairs, donated by Miramar Masonic Lodge; a TV, books, games, cards, etc., and a piano were given, or purchased with donations from friends, local businesses, and collections at Carrs, Fisons, British Railways and the RAF

Station. A donation of over £100 was received from the trustees of Silloth Town Band, which had gone out of existence. Apart from the gift of the building: a total of £700 was spent on equipment.

A Social Committee was formed to organise events such as Coffee Mornings, Domino Drives and Whist Drives, Rummage Sales, a Mile of Pennies and Open

the houses on their list, to invite any pensioners living there, to attend the Christmas Party. Names were also taken of housebound pensioners, not able to attend the party, and they received parcels. Alas, these events are no longer free, but they are subsidised from funds

Raffles. However, the full Committee organised the Annual Trip in June, the Anniversary Tea in September and the Christmas Party, as these events needed more organisation.

Up to five Coaches used to leave Silloth on the Trip and dinner would be provided, free to pensioners! Christmas Party tickets were also free to all Pensioners. The system was that all streets were divided up and a list given to each committee member, who then visited

to the hall every month; **Cumberland County** Council Northern Area Health Office paid the Association £26 per year for the use of the hall. The chiropodist transferred to Dr Yule's surgery in 1971.

In 1978 a modern kitchen was installed by Mr Douglas Walton and Mr Gilmore. New inside toilets were installed by the Manpower Commission in 1982.

Since it was opened, 50 years ago, the upkeep of the Hall and any subsidising of the Trip and come.

Christmas Party has been financed by the efforts of Committee members in raising money, many of whom have worked for many years to make it a success. In the early years, Mrs Crellin was the organiser of the Friday afternoon Whist Drives and also organised their Christmas Parties in the Recreation hall from 1959-1966.

The Public Whist and Domino Drives were organised by the Social Committee, helped by Mr Jack Thurlow and Mrs Davina Walton.

The Association has been helped over the years, by donations from local businesses in the town, Round Table, the SOS Charity Shop, members and also, grants from the Council and Neighbourhood Forum..

PC Andy Robertson reported on incidents attended to in the past month and stated that no one was on pub watch ban. He informed us that our new PCSO Christina Miles was due to start work very shortly.

Correspondence dealt with included a report from Allerdale Borough Council on dealings with the owners of the Skinburness Hotel with regard to the dangerous condition of the property. Sea Fishing in Cumbria

Skinburness to West Silloth

The coastline between Skinburness and Allonby has recently been described by a leading sea angling magazine as "The best flat fish fishing coastline in Great Britain" and a great many local and visiting anglers would totally agree.

Rarely do you hear of a days fishing resulting in an empty bag, with anglers ranging from the very young to the older more senior types.

All that is required is some proper preparation and the odd shovel full (or two) of good luck.

The key to good preparation is simple: a local tide table (published monthly in the Buzz), an adequate assortment of baits, Lugworm, peelers crab, squid, and oiled fillet (mackerel or blueys), an assortment of fishing rigs and hooks, a good rod and reel and last but not least, plenty of patience.

Skinburness

As any local angler will tell you, "If you want to catch "Flatties" then fish at Skinburness but, beware of the tackle grabbing rocks. Your best bet is to visit the area at low tide to pick your spot carefully. A basic "Flattie" rig loaded with either black lug or squid should result in some good fishing and if you

pick out one of the deeper gullies then you don't have to cast out for miles. Low tide is also quite rewarding

but don't get fooled into straying too far as the incoming tide can easily catch you out. This area is also well known for it's fantastic variety of sea life and birds.



Harbour Wall/ Lifeboat slipway

The section of wall between the lifeboat slipway and the harbour wall is very, very popular with local anglers at high tide, fishing best an 1 hour either side of high mark. Combination cocktails of oiled fillets tipped with squid have produced great catches of "Flatties", "Doggies" and the occasional rock fish. A great mark for younger anglers as there is no danger of getting caught by rising tides and dads

can literally park there cars right on the mark - no need to lug tackle down onto the beach. A bonus here is that a fantastic range of bait and tackle are available less than 500 yards away at Caravan Care in Station Road.

West Silloth -Tommy Legs

The beach on the far side of the harbour is affectionately known as "Tommy Legs" and is a brilliant low water mark. From the end of May until end of August, bass are often caught here and sometimes big enough to

do some bragging about. Flounders are also very abundant, often getting in the way of the real prey when your heart is set on catching a bass. Peeler crab, sand eel and/ or razor fish being the preferred bait but often a shiny lure or spinner will also do the trick.

Although not as popular in winter months, a brisk onshore wind will sometimes produce codling and whiting plus the occasional bass.

It's well worth noting at this point that, the tides along the Solway Firth can be very dangerous and low water marks should be vacated in good time, before the water covers the sand banks. Don't be tempted to give it another 20 minutes the water can come in very quickly behind you.

Bill aim to achieve sustainable management of the marine environment enabled by a new system of marine planning. Marine plans will provide a way of balancing protection of landscape and wildlife with demand for development and use of the sea.

There is widespread support for

the proposals which are strongly welcomed by a wide range of organisations including Solway Firth Partnership. However, there are major concerns on the Solway where UK and Scottish systems will meet at the national boundary through the centre of the estuary. Under current proposals this would mean two plans for the Solway which is an equally precious resource for people from both sides.

Solway Firth Partnership Chairman, Gordon Mann, said, "The communities on both sides of the Solway want to work together. The wildlife, landscape and human use of the Solway are bound together and need to be addressed under a single plan for the whole area. We need to ensure that what happens on one side is not going to have an adverse effect on the other side." The need for integrated management of the Solway is perhaps greater than anywhere else in Britain because the national boundary results in a particularly high number of organisations operating under different legal, cultural and social systems within a clearly defined area. Time is running short to influence marine legislation and Solway Firth Partnership is urging local people who agree that the Solway should be managed under a single marine plan to write to their local MP or MSP expressing their view




Charity Walk


