Silloth Music & Beer Festival Tickets now On

TICKETS are now on sale for the 10th Silloth Music and Beer Festival in September and the organisers have an extra reason to raise a glass in celebration.

Through clever use of Facebook and Twitter, traffic was up 34 per cent with nine per cent coming via Twitter, four per cent from Facebook, and eight per cent from local web and newspaper links.



Major New Event

Soldiers in Silloth

Military camps will be set up in Silloth in July. Roman soldiers, Vikings, Roundheads and even soldiers from the American Civil War will camp on the Green and demonstrate their skill at arms. Visitors will be able to see how soldiers and their followers lived in times gone by and even try out some of their weapons and uniforms.

After the success of last year's celebration at Silloth Docks (the brainchild of harbour master Chris Puxley) the organising committee wanted to try and hold a major event every year. As 2009 was

based on the sea and the navy, so in 2010 the theme will be land warfare – though the pirates who came last year are expected to return as well!

On July 9th and 10th Silloth Tourism Action Group (STAG) are presenting a historical re-enactment event featuring groups from all over the country living in authentic camps over the weekend and giving demonstrations of drill and battle tactics in the arena. You can visit the camps and talk to the soldiers and their campfollowers and inspect their equipment, armour and weapons.

Details will follow nearer the time but PUT JULY 10th & 11th IN YOUR DIARY!

The American Civil war Society

"Soldiers in Silloth" is also the official name of the tourist attraction promised for Silloth based round Tim Barker's collection of over 10,000 toy soldiers and related forts, tanks, etc, etc. Local volunteers have now established a limited company to run the project and it is hoped to open the exhibition centre later in 2010. This will probably not be till after the re-enactment weekend but you can see the connection.

The Primary School: roll numbers are falling due to the ongoing problem in relation to the head teacher, following discussions it was agreed to arrange a meeting with the Director of Education at which the Town Council will stress our fears for the long term health of the school, as the matter has been in limbo far too long. Joint Advisory: the five year management plan has been drawn up and circulated. S.T.A.G.: a full programme of events have been planned for the summer season. There may be a possible visit by a small cruise liner so the passengers may visit Appleby Horse Fair. North Allerdale Development Trust: the trust have taken over the Market Hall and Community Centre in Wigton and have held their first AGM prior to the official opening of the refurbished Market Hall. Silloth Health Matters: it has been agreed to use the residue of the funds in hand to support the sports held at the carnival. Solway Community Technology College: the school has gained a top 20% level for the second year running, the school also achieved a level 2 result from Ofsted, many students are staying late at school to enhance their learning.

Handymans Report

A gritter has been sourced for use around the town when the winter weather returns, replacement equipment has been purchased following the theft of much of the small tools/ machines over Christmas and new security measures are in place.

Financial Assistance Were received from the following groups, Silloth Vintage Rally it was agreed to award £1,500 towards the cost of the event. Solway Mexico Link it was agreed to award £1,000 towards the visit. Great North Air Ambulance it was agreed to give a donation of £500 to this worthy cause. S.T.A.G. it was agreed to award £6,000 from the tourism budget to help fund events on the Green.

Estimates are being sought for the painting of the Community Hall exterior, lettering on the war memorial and the water fountain on the green, together with the fitting of two self closing gates to the children's play


air fresheners which spray away from candles as these can cause a fire and also be careful where you place candles. He had leaflets and DVD's for everyone to take home.

He was thanked for a very informative and interesting talk by Margaret Peddar. Refreshments were served by Ann Lomas, Jean Key, and Myra Lawson.







This term saw the publication of the national achievement and attainment tables for the GCSE results for 2009. We were delighted to see that for the second year running the achievement scores of our students placed us in the top 10% of all schools nationally. We also had the third best CVA score in the County. In 2008 we were in the top 5.

OfSTED January

We knew that we would receive an inspection during the course of the year but were definitely surprised to receive a phone call on the morning of 22nd January to tell us that three inspectors would be arriving in school at 8am on Monday 25th January. Staff (both teaching and non teaching), students and governors worked hard to make sure that the school looked its best when the inspection team

We are very pleased with the report which provides confirmation of how the school has improved. Our only frustration comes from the fact that the verbal feedback which we received from the inspectors was more fulsome than the actual report. The report is subject to a word count and is very much written to a formula so the words "impressive" and "inspirational" don't appear.

The students excelled during the inspection and were clearly keen to show

the inspection team what they know, understand and can do. We received very many supportive letters from parents and community members which showed how much our community values our young people and the school. Thank you to all those parents who responded with comments as well as returning the parental survey forms.

We know that 93% of all the teaching seen was judged to be good or outstanding and none was judged to be inadequate. This is testimony to the hard work of staff. "Students do much better than expected because of the good teaching." The inspectors were very keen to see how we worked with students and parents to gain high achievement and attainment.

We are very proud of the school and what the students, parents, governors and staff have achieved.

Stay 'Til Late

We are very pleased that so many of our current Year 11 students are staying after school to ensure that coursework is completed to the highest possible standard. This week 79% of year 11 students have stayed from 3pm to 7pm to complete the OCR ICT coursework which will be moderated by an external examiner in the first week back after half term. 

Lowest Council Tax!

Our council tax is the lowest in the Cumbria

A 1.9% increase in Allerdale Borough Council's portion of council tax was agreed at the meeting of full Council on 3rd March, meaning that its portion is still the lowest district council tax in the county by far.

For a band A property in Silloth this means an increase in Allerdale Borough Council's portion of the council tax of £1.79 for the year and for a band D property an increase of £2.69.

Although district councils, such as Allerdale, collect all the council tax, the money is shared between the district council, the county council, the police authority and the parish council. The largest share of the council tax bill is set by Cumbria County Council, who takes threequarters of the cash, that is £1,161.50 for a band D property in Silloth, the Police take around 12% or £193.89 and Silloth Town Council receives 6% or £95.76



It is possible to add so much needed colour in the garden, either in containers or your borders, plant some goodsized clumps of extraearly flowering perennials which will bloom year after year.

Bergenias brighten up dull corners and they'll grow almost anywhere. The spikes of mauve-pink flowers contrast with the huge leathery leaves, known as elephant's ears, which in some varieties take on a purplish tint in cold weather. They look especially good grouped together, with most varieties flowering in early spring.

Snowdrops can be lifted and divided into smaller clumps while still in leaf,

According to the RH's, people seem to have gone snowdrop crazy. Bidding on the online auction site Ebay has reached fever pitch this spring, with a single bulb of the rare pure white G. reginae-olgae 'Autumn Snow' snapped up for £162. Other prices reached this year include G. nivalis 'Ecusson d'Or', which went for £145.03 a bulb, and G. plicatus 'Wandlebury Ring',

which sold for £123.

Everybody loves Tulips, and this time of year they are a great source of colour in the garden, with their long stems they can add some great structure to the garden or patio and balcony.

Pots of daffodils can be put into the garden after flowering.

- Seeds to be sown, and watch out for insects as soon as it starts to warm up, they will begin to feed on our plants. So take action with shop bought insecticides or organic methods such as nematodes or companion planting, ie Grow French marigolds among tomatoes. Marigolds emit a strong odour that will repel greenfly and blackfly.
- Grow sage with carrots or plants in the cabbage family to ward off pests. Both have strong scents that drive away each other's pests.
- Garlic planted among roses will ward-off aphids.
- Plant carrots and leeks together on the allotment or vegetable patch to protect against a number of pests. Leeks repel carrot fly and carrots repel onion fly and leek moth.

Soon, April will be with us so, until next time, happy planting.


