Silloth vicarage is now officially occupied not simply by the Vicar of Silloth but by the Team Rector of the Solway Plain Team Ministry. Reverend Canon Bryan Rothwell (to give his full title, though he's quite happy to be called simply 'Bryan') was inducted into his new office on September 6th at a service in Christ Church.

The Bishop of Carlisle presided and the service which was organised by the Rural Dean Rev Mary Day, while Archdeacon Richard Pratt introduced Bryan to his new benefice and preached.

It was one of the most blustery of all the windy nights that week but the church was packed with local people, members of all the seven churches that make up the Team Ministry plus representatives from other

churches and community organisations.

The Solway Plain Team Choir sang and young people from local schools presented the new Rector with symbolic gifts to mark his new ministry. As a final act of the service Bryan's hand was laid on the door of the church which he opened wide. The Bishop led prayers for the community before going out and leaving the way open for everyone to head for the church hall and an enormous buffet.

Let us all welcome Bryan, his wife Ann-Louise and sons Jonathan, Ben and Daniel to the Solway Coast.

The seven churches that make up the Team Ministry are Abbeytown, Bromfield, Causewayhead, Holme St Cuthberts, Silloth, Waverton and Westnewton.

Volunteers Required

The Community Bus committee are appealing for volunteers to offer to drive the bus.

Some groups have their own drivers which is good, but drivers are required for the Monday Luncheon Club which has about twelve members. The luncheon club is each Monday from about 11am to 1:30pm. This does not mean the same person has to drive every week as we operate a rota system depending on the drivers available.

The other service not covered is the library run. This is about one hour on alternate Mondays.

This is becoming urgent as the present drivers are due to finish because of the 70 age rule regarding insurance. Anyone with a car licence gained on or before 1997 can drive the bus. People who qualified since then need to take a test.

Also, the Monday Luncheon Club needs ladies to assist with serving up the food. This is also done on a rota system. We hope that help will be forthcoming and keep this worthwhile service going.

Solway Wetlands Landscape Partnership Scheme

An exciting project is being developed on the Solway Plain which could bring £2.7 million to the area from April 2012-2015.

The three year project, predominantly funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund, is focused on understanding and conserving the landscape of the area, in particular on the mosses, and as such runs from Allonby to Wigton to Kirkbampton and up to the coast. It is a partnership project with input from the Solway Coast Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) based in Silloth, the Cumbria Wildlife Trust, the Environment Agency, Natural England, RSPB and West Cumbria Tourism.

It has several aims:

- To conserve and restore the natural and built heritage by restoring a wet meadow complete with a viewing area at an RSPB site as well as the renovation of a barn for education and visitor facilities;
- To provide opportunities for more community participation such as through

the establishment of a community trust to ensure that there is a legacy after the project and to enable local people to have their say. Also there will be an education and an events programme focusing not only on the wetlands but also on birds, heritage, photography, walks, painting, cycling, etc.

- To provide better physical access using board walk on the mosses, better interpretation, and maybe a few apps. It also aims to increase learning opportunities such as through a schools' wetland field to complement the renovated barn at Bowness and through a community designed lookout tower over one of the mosses; and finally
- To provide skills training through apprenticeships in Environment and Conservation, heritage skills training for contractors and the general public and archaeological field surveying and excavation based on the monastic period.

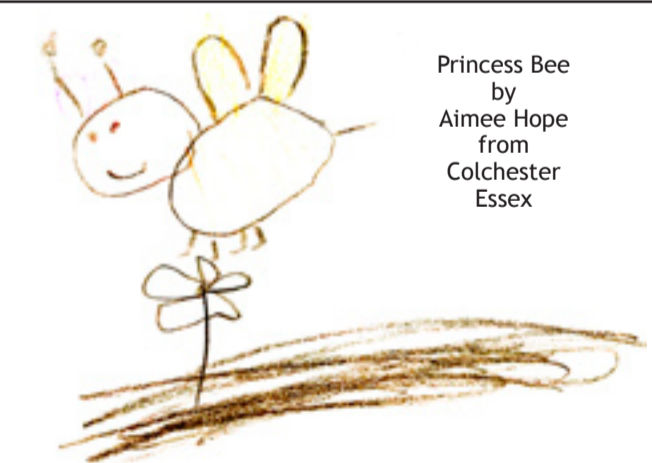
There will be plenty of opportunities for people

from inside and outside the area to become involved whether that's through the schools, as a conservation volunteer, as a building contractor, as part of the archaeological surveying or by building a clay dabbin. The events programme will be spread all over the area and there will be something for everyone so there's no excuse to not be involved!

At the moment we are very interested to hear from people who have snippets of local history in their lives and who would like to share them. This may be

old photos, farming or peat cutting implements, proggy mats or period clothing. We would like to create a portfolio of heritage artefacts in the area.

Have your say on parliamentary constituency boundaries

Allerdale Borough Council is encouraging residents in Allerdale to check out proposals for new parliamentary constituency boundaries.

The Boundary Commission for England have started a twelve week consultation on its proposals.

Allerdale residents can go along to the following venues to view a map and read the initial proposals: Allerdale House, Workington; Customer Service Centre, Town Hall, Oxford Street, Workington; Customer Service Centre, Town Hall, Senhouse Street, Maryport; Customer Service Centre, Town Hall, Main Street, Keswick; Local links, Market Hall, Wigton; Customer Service Centre, Fairfield car park, Cockermouth; Local Links, Aspatia Library; Tourist Information Centre, Liddell Street, Silloth and Town Hall, Market Street, Cockermouth.

The consultation closes on Monday, 5th December. Responses to the consultation should be returned to the Boundary Commission who will make a formal report to the Government recommending any changes it believes are appropriate to the distribution, size, shape, name or designation of constituencies in England.

Caring for those who Care

West Cumbria Carers are seeking volunteers to help provide support to unpaid Carers in their local community.

Being a carer can have a significant impact on an individual's life. The caring role is often the main responsibility of only one person, and many carers say they are forced to ignore their own health or are unable to take breaks or attend appointments because of a lack of alternative care. Carers often become socially isolated, losing touch with friends and family and many have to give up work, adding to feelings of loneliness and being cut-off from others.

A carer's main concern is the person they care for, and as a result carers generally tend to place their own needs at the bottom of their priority lists. However it is vital that carers take care of themselves in order to maintain their own physical, emotional and mental health, thus enabling them to continue in their caring role.

Encouraging and enabling carers to take respite breaks or to have one-to-one support from a trained volunteer can help to alleviate stress and therefore minimise adverse effects on their own long term health, reduce isolation and provide a respite from their caring role.

Our Volunteers fulfil a number of roles to achieve this:



Respite Sitters regularly visit and sit with the cared-for (provided there are no practical care needs), enabling the Carer to have a valuable break, with peace of mind that the person they care for is safely looked after.

Carer Supporters will regularly visit a Carer who needs support, it may be that due to their caring role they have become socially isolated or lost their social support networks. The volunteer will have a chat and provide support, or assist with re-entering the community and becoming socially active again.

Drivers can help alleviate transport difficulties and are often needed to help with attending events, support groups or essential appointments.

Counsellors provide one-to-one counselling support to Carers who feel themselves in need of this specialist form of therapy as a result of their caring role.

West Cumbria Carers covers West Cumbria

(incorporating the districts of Allerdale and Copeland) and our aim is to provide support to carers who look after a family member, relative, friend or neighbour who could not manage without their help. This could be due to age, physical or mental illness, disability or addiction.

Volunteers are an essential and valued part of our services for carers and we like to ensure volunteers enjoy their activities and are fully supported within their volunteering role. All volunteers receive free training to ensure they are able to start volunteering with confidence and are given on-going support and training throughout. In addition, volunteers will have the opportunity to meet other volunteers and new people, learn new skills, help others in the community and know they have made a real difference.

Volunteers don't need any special skills or experience, though if they are sensitive and caring about others they will already have valuable qualities that will enable them to make a great volunteer and help to make a difference to the life of a carer. The next training course for volunteers is planned for November and the Volunteer Coordinator, Nia-Maria Quinlan, will be happy to have a chat with anyone interested in volunteering.

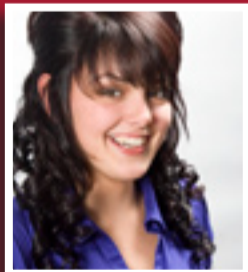

How To Survive the Titanic, Or the Sinking of J. Bruce Ismay
by Frances Wilson

It is close to 100 years since the Titanic sank. In some ways, the legend becomes all the more powerful, with each passing year.

Frances Wilson has written this wonderfully rich and multi-layered book about J Bruce Ismay, the chairman and managing director of White Star Lines, the man branded for eternity as a rogue and a coward. Knowing that there were icebergs in the vicinity he urged his captain to go full steam ahead; and yet it was Ismay who leapt into a lifeboat leaving two thirds of his passengers to drown.

Frances Wilson gives us her interpretation of the events, each taken from a different witness. She does not give an opinion as to whether Ismay jumped, stepped or was pushed on to the lifeboat. One person remembered him getting into the very first life-boat. Another maintained he was the first person onto the lifeboat and that he even hand picked his own crew to row him to safety. However, within days he had been given the nickname J Brute



Ismay

But was he really all that bad? Frances Wilson portrays him as sympathetically as possible. He was, she concludes in her intense thoughtful way, "an ordinary man caught in extraordinary circumstances".

He was not nearly as bad as he was painted, though nor was he as good as he tried to paint himself. He did not take the first boat or even the second - apparently it was the 14th, as he left 1,500 to perish.

This book is full of fascinating details, not only about Ismay but also a variety of minor characters. It is a finely written biography of a disgraced human being.

by Christopher Ward

Grief, love, loss, betrayal, tragedy; the sinking of the Titanic did more than claim thousands of souls on board, it created a ripple effect of tsunami proportions for the ones unfortunate enough to be left behind.

When Jock, aged twenty one, boarded the ill-fated vessel, he left behind a pregnant fiancée, an estranged family and a community of people who loved him. Though the book is primarily about the author's grandfather, it does not end with his death. Rather the opposite.

And the Band Played On is more about the people



Jock left behind, and the way their lives were irrevocably changed after the ship went down.....

Immensely intriguing, very interesting but emotional. Make sure you have tissues to hand.

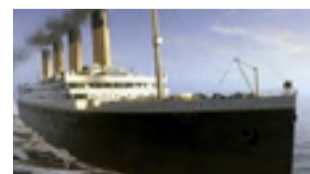

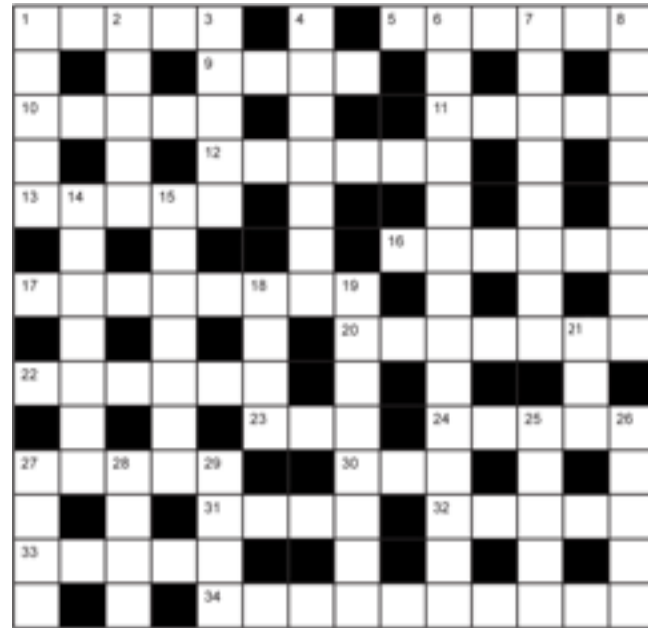

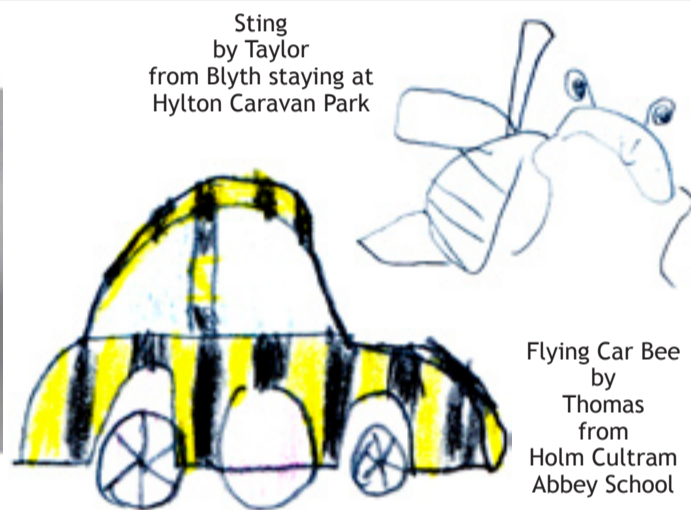
